The race for the top eight

The race for finals is tight. The ladder position for every team is uncertain. We are down to the final five games before the 2020 finals campaign kicks off. At this point in the season, every fan is doing the math and predicting their teams chance of playing finals. However, one can never predict what is going to happen. 'Easy' games can turn into a team's nightmare and loss of momentum can kick a team out of the eight if other results go against you.

We almost witnessed nightmare results for Port Adelaide, Geelong and West Coast. While all three teams are in a safe spot to play finals, losing games you are expected to win is crushing for momentum. West Coast have the best argument for their 12-point win; GWS are a threat when they play their best footy, but their inconsistency is why they sit at 11th. However, Port Adelaide and Geelong played 15th and 18th respectively. Geelong managed to put the crows away in the fourth quarter to win comfortably by 28 points. Yet, the third quarter margin was only 9 points in Geelong's favour. Port Adelaide, on the other hand, had to fight until the final siren. Hawthorn had transformed their on-field behaviour by taking on their 'unsociable' label from their glory days, which proved a task for ladder leaders Port. Port only just escaped from a loss to the Hawks after a combined effort from Scott Lycett, Zak Butters and Ollie Wines to produce a goal in the final two minutes.

The teams at the top of the table are tasked with finishing off their season strongly against teams sitting comfortably below them. All four teams are facing games over the final five rounds which they are expected to win, especially with a bye in the next two weeks to recover.

Meanwhile, teams hovering around the eight spot cut-off are facing a tough battle over the coming weeks. Desperation is the key to securing those final spots up for grabs. Who can string together consistent performances, and who wants it more? Also, who deserves to be there come finals? From 6th position to 11th, the battle for top eight is tight; only two games separate 6th from 11th. St Kilda, Western Bulldogs, Collingwood, Melbourne, Carlton and GWS are the six clubs hanging closely around the top eight cut-off. During the final home and away rounds these clubs need to prove why they should play finals football.

Out of all six teams, St Kilda deserve a spot the most. After finishing 14th last year, they have taken on board new coaching leadership and produced a fresh style of football. The Saints are exciting to watch and have developed brilliantly under Brett Ratten, especially young players like Max King.

Finally, Melbourne, Carlton and GWS are sitting just outside the top eight. If results go their way, there is no reason these clubs will not play finals football. However, it is a question of whether or not they should. Melbourne, while they are the closest to breaking the eight, have produced some of the worst performances of football this year. If they can prove they are back on track then there is no reason they do not deserve a spot. They certainly have the personnel required to produce good, exciting football.

GWS and Carlton have similar fixtures in terms of difficulty. So it will be whoever can prove their worth. However, Carlton lack the experience required to make a run for the finals after battling for so many years. While GWS will be looking to return to the finals stage after a disappointing finish last year against Richmond.

Either way, the battle for the final top eight spots is well and truly a tough one. No doubt, these teams will be fighting hard to secure a place in finals and, ultimately, a chance to contend for the 2020 premiership.

Overrated #3: Chad Wingard

Perception: Elite, A-Grade Superstar

Reality: Talented Player

While Chad Wingard began his career in emphatic fashion, kicking 148 goals from 89 games in his first four seasons... the early Ken Hinkley days at Port Adelaide still remain his best seasons. While certainly capable of producing match winning moments, incredible skills by foot and the ability to take the ball in the air and out of packs, Wingard is sporadic and tends to have drift in and out of games. While disappointed to lose their favourite-son, Port are winning the Wingard-Burton trade at this point in time.

Underrated #3: Brad Sheppard

Reason: In the shadow of Premiership stars who play similar roles ie. McGovern, Hurn, Yeo etc.

Brad Sheppard is easily the most underrated Eagle. While he doesn't have the aerial ability of Jeremy McGovern or the penetrating boot of Shannon Hurn, he has always been a reliable defender who works as the link from defence to midfield. His ability to run off half back cannot be underestimated. Averaging 16 possessions in 2020, he is every chance to finally get that premiership medal he missed out on in 2018.

Overrated #2: Dyson Heppell

Perception: One of the best midfielders in the game.

Reality: 2011 NAB Rising Star winner.

While Dyson Heppell is certainly skilful and by all means a good player and captain, he is nowhere near the level of a Martin, Fyfe or Dangerfield. He gets enough of the ball and does usually use it well, he doesn't impact the game as much as some think. He isn't overly quick, nor is he overly versatile. He rarely goes into the forward line and kick goals, nor does he go in defence... something many A-Graders do. He also has not translated his great games into finals... playing in four losing elimination finals.

Underrated #2: David Mundy

Reason: Playing for the smaller of two Western Australian clubs.

David Mundy just keeps on keeping on, and is now second on the all time Fremantle games played list. Since his debut, he has been a solid, durable and consistent performer who has given his heart and soul to the Dockers. An elite field kick, strong mark and physically imposing, Mundy is tough to quell. Still averages 18 possessions at 70% efficiency at 35 years of age... may very well play on in 2021.

Perception: Won a flag in 2016

Reality: Plays 1-3 truly great games a season.

Good player, fun to watch and can be trusted in kicking 2-4 goals per game and winning All-Australian. Just because you're a potential match winner, does not necessarily mean you're a superstar. While Stringer is talented, he isn't elite by AFL standards and has only kicked more than 40 goals in a season once. A solid B-Grade forward at his absolute best.

Underrated #1: Jarryd Lyons

Reason: Always played with superstars ie. Sloane, Dangerfield, Ablett, Hodge, Neale etc.

Jarryd Lyons has always been in the shadow of some modern day champions. While isn't as fast, silky, skilful or exciting to watch as a Gary Ablett Jnr, Patrick Dangerfield or Lachie Neale, what Jarryd Lyons brings it cannot be denied. What Lyons lacks in speed, he makes up for in ball use. He finds the football and uses it well, averaging 22 possessions or more since 2016, extracting to ball from the contest, creating opportunities for his forwards. If Jarryd Lyons was removed from Brisbane, the likes of Lachie Neale and Dayne Zorko would be double-manned and the connection would be stifled. Could be a premiership player this season.

The Grand Stadium

The AFL Grand Final has always been played at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG). The tradition, in fact, is so sacred to some footy fans and sponsors that even if two Perth teams were to make it to the final, they would have to travel across the entire country and play in Melbourne. That's not even mentioning the fact that Victorian teams have a sort of home ground advantage, or at least familiarity with the ground, against opponents who are from other states.

Although the MCG holds the greatest number of supporters at around 100,000, it should not act to any team's advantage when it comes to the Grand Final.

For years, fans and commentators, admittedly from non-Victorian states, have called for a change of venue when it comes to the Grand Final. After so many consecutive final games played at the MCG, that special feeling is finally starting to perish. And that's not to undermine the greatness of the MCG. However, a proper proposal should be put in place before demands for other states to host the Grand Final begin. It may be that more emphasis must be put on the season standings, in terms of points and percentage.

For example, if the team who finished 3rd made it to the final against a team which finished 5th on the ladder, then the club that achieved a higher standing on the ladder in that season should be the team to host the Grand Final. Now, that's just a proposal, but it's important for the AFL to think about these types of things to spread the popularity and experience of the Grand Final across Australia and its other states. Maybe it could be a random draw each year, or a type of system where the states take turns. There are endless common sensical ways to solve this unfair situation.

As for this year, a change in venue seems almost mandatory. In terms of the current global pandemic, Victoria has been the one Australian state most effected by the spread of COVID-19. So then, the question arises as to where the Grand Final will be played in 2020, and exactly what will influence the AFL to make that decision. A proposal must be put in place, similar to the one mentioned earlier in this article. Although there is still plenty of time until the Grand Final, I think it's only fair to say that this is the year that the AFL should experiment with changing the venue of the final.

The pride of South Australia is not the mighty Adelaide Crows

It's been a difficult year for all clubs this season, but it seems no team more so than the Adelaide Crows have buckled under the pressure of fly-in-fly-out games, hubs and a compressed fixture. After losing many of their star players in the off-season including Eddie Betts, Cam Ellis-Yolmen, Alex Keath, Josh Jenkins and Sam Jacobs, the Crows said they would begin a rebuild, but no one could have expected this.

The Crows have gone from top to bottom in just three years. When there are only two South Australian teams in the competition the chances of them being on completely opposite sides of the ladder is extremely rare. So when your cross-town rivals Port Adelaide are the ladder-leaders while the Adelaide Crows are 18th and bottom there really isn't much to smile about.

It's been a challenging season for Crows fans to watch loss after loss after loss. Their performance against the Sydney Swans in Round 1 was probably their best and most convincing chance of taking home the win, but need I remind you that too was a loss. Rory Laird has been one of the few positives to take away from their games. He has been excellent on the field since moving to the midfield providing pressure to a side with very little and was the leading disposal winner against the Pies in Round 11 with 37 possessions for the night.

Laird has really led the way of this youthful side. Unfortunately, that's where the good news ends.

The Adelaide Crows have made several changes to their list, recruiting Ben Keays ex-Brisbane player, Ben Crocker ex-Collingwood player and former Port Adelaide ruckman Billy Frampton. Rookie Ben Keays has been quite serviceable after spending most of his AFL career playing in the reserves at Brisbane.

The Crows have had an AFL-high eight debutants and used 37 players across the course of the season, which is more than any other club. While it has been excellent to give so many young players more experience in the AFL and more opportunity to develop, it does seem odd that some of their more-experienced players are not making the team. Now when a player like Bryce Gibbs and even Billy Frampton to an extent, cannot even make the team when that team is losing every week, something must be wrong. Especially when these two players would give the Crows a boost in two areas they seem to be lacking in, a target inside-50 and a strong, clearance-winning midfielder.

This season the Crows have had many big outs, with Rory Sloane, Taylor Walker, Tom Doedee, Daniel Talia, Tom Lynch, Brad Crouch, Wayne Milera, Riley Knight and Jordan Gallucci all sidelined for extended periods. The Crows have struggled in all areas on the field, their depleted list would not have helped but they just seem to be lacking, not running as hard, no consistency

THE DIVISION 5 Match Previews



Colonel Light Gardens vs. Fitzroy

Third-placed Colonel Light Gardens travelled to Fitzroy Sports Club to take on the ninth-placed Fitzroy Lions. REVIEW:

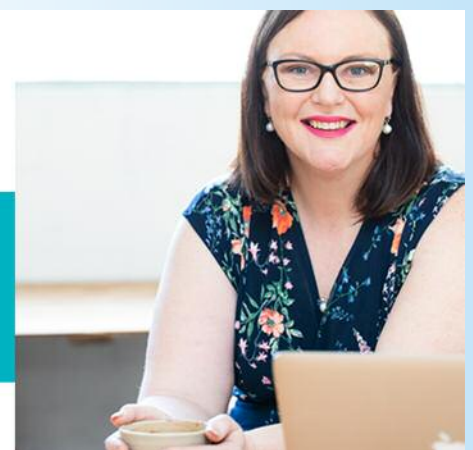

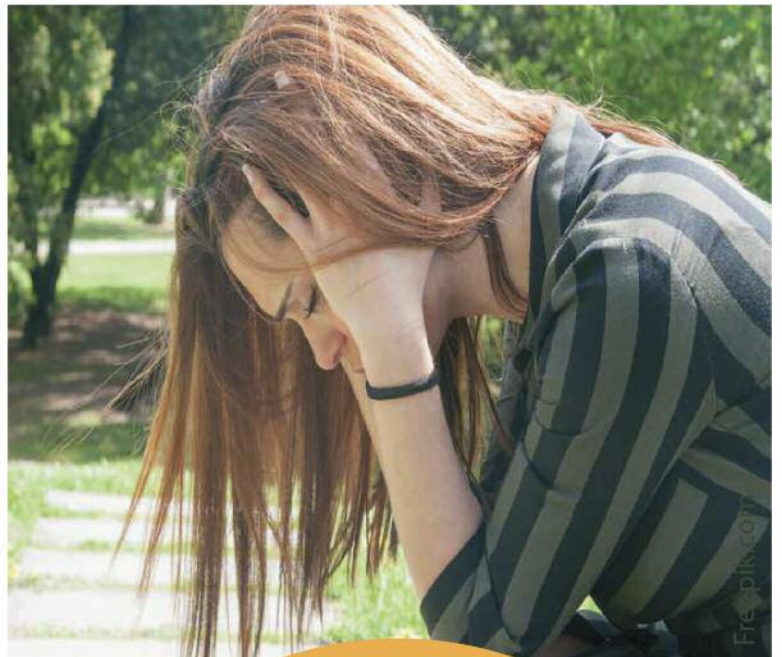
