### **Adelaide Crows v Hawthorn**

**Adelaide Oval - 5.10pm (Tuesday)** 

# If ever the Crows were going to get "on the board" this season it will be against the struggling Hawks

Despite falling short of that elusive first win for 2020, Adelaide will enter the match against Hawthorn with renewed confidence after a vast improvement against Geelong. The Crows matched it with one of the premiership favourites for the first three quarters, trailing by just nine points, before being overrun in the final term.

In his 200th match Taylor Walker displayed great energy, laying four tackles, but was kept goalless for the fifth time this year. Matt Crouch (22 disposals, 14 tackles) was the Crows' best midfielder. Kyle Hartigan showed his potential as a key defender keeping Tom Hawkins to four marks, though he still managed to kick three goals and extend his lead in the Coleman Medal.

Hawthorn made Port Adelaide work hard to secure the four points on Saturday night, trailing by less than a kick with two minutes left in the match, before falling 10 points short. Best players for the Hawks were James Worpel (26 disposals, four clearances), Tom Mitchell (25 disposals, five clearances) and James Cousins (17 dispoals, eight inside 50s) who stepped up to fill the void left by the injured Jaeger O'Meara, who broke his hand against West Coast.

Hawthorn are officially the 'home team' in the match – their third in a row at Adelaide Oval. The Hawks have called the Barossa Valley home for the past fortnight and have been using the facilities of the Tanunda Football Club.

South Australians playing for the Hawks include veteran midfielder Shaun Burgoyne (Mallee Park), half forward Chad Wingard (Murray Bridge Imperials) and Will Day (PHOS Camden/Sacred Heart College) playing his first season of AFL.

After having one of the shortest injury lists for most of the season, Hawthorn had a horror match against West Coast. James Sicily ruptured his right ACL and will miss the remainder of this season and most of 2021. James Frawley (dislocated thumb) and Jack Gunston (back) also missed the match against the Power and, along with O'Meara, will be unlikely to recover in time for Tuesday night's match. Another factor giving the Crows a chance is their nine day break between matches, compared to Hawthorn's five day break.

Adelaide will arguably still be missing more key players than Hawthorn. The hamstrung Brad Crouch and Tom Doedee will leave the Crows a midfielder and defender short against the Hawks and unless the less-experienced players can lift accordingly, Adelaide will fall agonisingly short of victory.

### **Port Adelaide v Sydney Swans**

# Inconsistent Swans won't bother the Power who still aren't playing their best football

It may not have been as convincing as Port Adelaide fans had hoped, but their team returned to the winners list last Saturday evening with a 10-point victory over Hawthorn.

The Hawks got the early jump, kicking the first three goals of the contest before Port were able to work its way into things.

It was a genuine arm wrestle for the first three quarters, as the three-quarter time siren blowing with scores tied at 52 points apiece. Port flexed its muscle defensively in the last quarter, allowing just a single score (a Shaun Burgoyne goal from outside 50m) from only six Hawthorn inside 50's. Although Port only kicked two last quarter goals itself, this defensive performance was what got it over the line.

Port's final goal was the best of the game. It led by four points with two minutes on the clock and a stoppage 20 metres out from goal. Scott Lycett allowed the ball-up to drop to his hip, before tapping it perfectly into the path of Zak Butters who flew through the stoppage and kicked the sealing goal. Butters was quick to acknowledge the selfless block of vice-captain Ollie Wines when interviewed post-game, after it allowed him to get free of his opponent.

After being smashed around the ball against Geelong a week earlier, Port's midfield was able to get back on track, led by Travis Boak (34 disposals and nine clearances) and Tom Rockliff (28 disposals). Port finished +18 in contested ball and +10 in clearances with Robbie Gray and Sam Powell-Pepper also impressive, spending more time in the midfield.

This win keeps Port on top of the table for at least another week, and it now sits 9.2% ahead of Brisbane. Meanwhile, teams hovering around the eight spot cut-off are facing a tough battle over the coming weeks. Desperation is the key to securing those final spots up for grabs. Who can string together consistent performances, and who wants it more? Also, who deserves to be there come finals? From 6th position to 11th, the battle for top eight is tight; only two games separate 6th from 11th. ### Over and Unders: Top three rated current AFL players

Overrated #3: Chad Wingard

Perception: Elite, A-Grade Superstar

Reality: Talented Player

While Chad Wingard began his career in emphatic fashion, kicking 148 goals from 89 games in his first four seasons... the early Ken Hinkley days at Port Adelaide still remain his best seasons. While certainly capable of producing match winning moments, incredible skills by foot and the ability to take the ball in the air and out of packs, Wingard is sporadic and tends to have drift in and out of games. While disappointed to lose their favourite-son, Port are win-

ning the Wingard-Burton trade at this point in time.



### **Underrated #3: Brad Sheppard**

Reason: In the shadow of Premiership stars who play similar roles ie. McGovern, Hurn, Yeo etc. Brad Sheppard is easily the most underrated Eagle. While he doesn't have the aerial ability of Jeremy McGovern or the penetrating boot of Shannon Hurn, he has always been a reliable defender who works as the link from defence to midfield. His ability to run off half back cannot he underestimated. Averaging 16 possessions in 2020, he is every chance to finally get that premiership medal he missed out on in 2018.

### Overrated #2: Dyson Heppell

Perception: One of the best midfielders in the game.

Reality: 2011 NAB Rising Star winner.

While Dyson Heppell is certainly skilful and by all means a good player and captain, he is no where near the level of a Martin, Fyfe or Dangerfield. He gets enough of the ball and does usually use it well, he doesn't impact the game as much as some think. He isn't overly guick, nor is he overly versatile. He rarely goes into the forward line and kick goals, nor does he go in defence... something many A-Graders do. He also has not translated his great games into finals... playing in four losing elimination finals.

### **Underrated #2: David Mundy**

Reason: Playing for the smaller of two Western Australian clubs.

David Mundy just keeps on keeping on, and is now second on the all time Fremantle games played list. Since his debut, he has been a solid, durable and consistent performer who has given his heart and soul to the Dockers. An elite field kick, strong mark and physically imposing, Mundy is tough to guell. Still averages 18 possessions at 70% efficiency at 35 years of age... may very well play on in 2021.

### **Over and Unders: Top three rated current AFL players**

Overrated #1: Jake Stringer Perception: Won a flag in 2016

Reality: Plays 1-3 truly great games a season.

Good player, fun to watch and can be trusted in kicking 2-4 goals per game and winning All-Australian. Just because you're a potential match winner, does not

necessarily mean you're a superstar. While Stringer is talented, he isn't elite by AFL standards and has only kicked more than 40 goals in a season once. A solid B-Grade forward at his absolute best.



That's not even mentioning the fact that Victorian teams have a sort of home ground advantage, or at least familiarity with the ground, against opponents who are from other states.

Although the MCG holds the greatest number of supporters at around 100,000, it should not act to any team's advantage when it comes to the Grand Final.

For years, fans and commentators, admittedly from non-Victorian states, have called for a change of venue when it comes to the Grand Final. After so many consecutive final games played at the MCG, that special feeling is finally starting to perish. And that's not to undermine the greatness of the MCG. However, a proper proposal should be put in place before demands for other states to host the Grand Final begin. 




