

Home finals are advantageous, but they are not deal-breakers!

This is the season like no other. In July, given the current global pandemic and increasing COVID-19 cases in Victoria, the decision was made that all Victorian AFL teams were to relocate to various States across the country and hub there for the remainder of the 2020 season. While this allowed the season to continue, the only downfall was that these teams then had to play their "home" games at grounds in which they rarely played at. Those teams who have been able to play at home have a big edge on the rest of the competition, but could it decide who wins the flag?

The end of the season is nearing, and the top eight teams have been decided. The current coronavirus control measures in place has meant that there are only four grounds where matches will be played for the finals – Adelaide Oval, the Gabba, Metricon Stadium and Optus Stadium (where only one elimination final will take place). While six teams have won the right to play a home final only three teams will actually play at their home ground, and coincidentally the three teams are the only non-Victorian teams in the eight: Port Adelaide, Brisbane Lions and West Coast Eagles. This will be the first time in the history of the AFL where there will be no finals played in Melbourne, but with five Victorian sides left in the competition, how much impact will this have on their push for the premiership?

There's a reason they call it a home-ground advantage and why teams and fans alike want to finish as close to the top of the ladder as possible, so they can guarantee themselves a home final and give themselves the best possible chance of winning finals and then holding up that elusive premiership cup. Not having to travel, ground familiarity and supporters are three of the main factors that give you an advantage when playing at home. This season Brisbane are undefeated at the Gabba, West Coast are undefeated at Optus Stadium while Port Adelaide have won seven matches and only lost one at the Adelaide Oval.

Sitting at first and second on the ladder respectively, Port Adelaide guaranteed themselves two home finals at the Adelaide Oval, likewise Brisbane guaranteed themselves two home finals at the Gabba. The Grand Final is being played at the Gabba this year, so despite possibly being the "away" team, Brisbane could end up playing all of their matches at their home fortress and given their current form this would make them premiership favourites. Due to the current COVID-19 restrictions in Western Australia, West Coast will only play one home final at Optus Stadium. That's at least five of nine matches which will definitely be played at these teams' home ground (COVID-19 dependent). Therefore, do the three non-Victorian teams in the eight have more of an advantage? It's more than likely that those teams playing at their home ground for finals will have some advantage over their opponents, but five top eight teams have played very few games at



their home ground and yet have managed to finish in the top eight. To reward the teams finishing higher on the ladder and mitigating any advantage to away sides playing at "home", the likes of Geelong, Richmond and Saint Kilda will get the opportunity to decide where they want their "home" final to be held between the three grounds – Adelaide Oval, the Gabba and Metricon Stadium. Having earned that right to nominate a preferred ground to play their home finals at, if they are scheduled to compete against either Port or Brisbane you would expect them to select a different ground to the normal

Home finals do not always result in victory. Putting it into perspective, last year Brisbane had two home finals at the Gabba but lost both of them, while retrospectively in 2018 when West Coast won the premiership, they played both the semi-final and preliminary final at home. Then way back in 2016, the Western Bulldogs played and won four away finals matches and went on to win the premiership that year. The saying goes, to be the best you have to beat the best and win anywhere and beating the best at their home ground is about as big as it gets. Those teams that can beat their opponents at their opponent's home ground or at a ground less familiar to them, will be more than just premiership pretenders and seen as true premiership contenders.

The home stretch for the premiership decider is just around the corner as eight teams prepare to battle it out for a spot. The last few spots to play in finals were uncertain going into the final round, but now the spots are finalised and the stage is set. The Western Bulldogs and the Saints have snuck into the final eight leaving Melbourne and GWS out in the cold. While Brisbane and Port Adelaide have claimed the top two

spots after a dominant season. The minor premiership will be decided tonight as Port Adelaide look to defeat Collingwood.

Brisbane and Port Adelaide will both earn themselves a place in AFL history if they take out the McClelland Trophy. Brisbane, despite their four year Grand Final run in the early 2000s, have not won the minor premiership. While Port Adelaide will be named as the seventh team to hold top spot for the home-and-away season if they defeat Collingwood. However, Chris Fagan and Ken Hinkley have both stated that while the recognition would be nice, it means nothing in finals.

Ladder positions in the home-and-away season mean nothing in finals if you are not up for the task. Anything can happen. Teams must play their best footy or risk an early finals departure. So, their players need to be up to the challenge. Finals footy is exactly the time when big players have to stand up and lead the charge. Every team in the finals race have players who can change the game by playing their best footy.

Lachie Neale is the obvious choice for Brisbane. He attacks the football hard and plays with incredible power, but he also has some young talent around him. Injecting youth into the side has been a part of many team's plans this season as it inspires experienced players to play with freedom. Travis Boak is certainly one of those players who has the support of young talent around him. Without question Boak is having his greatest season yet, and him playing well in the finals will be crucial for Port Adelaide's game.

West Coast and Geelong's respective gun midfielders Tim Kelly and Patrick Dangerfield are huge influencers on their team's ball movement. Both teams have an incredible midfield, but those two player's lead the charge when they play their best football. Dustin Martin and Jack Riewoldt are unsurprisingly players who can turn any game on its head, but Shai Bolton has proved himself to be an important part of Richmond's game plan.

Collingwood's mix of experience in Scott Pendelbury and youth in Jordan De Goey let it speak for itself against the Suns in round 17. While there is debate on whether De Goey should even be playing, his football is the one thing you cannot argue with when he plays his best. The Western Bulldogs have a similar situation as Bailey Smith continues to impress fans, while Bontempelli

Is a Tiger dynasty about to happen?

Premierships are rare, every team wants to win one, trains an entire preseason and plays an entire season in search of one... but only one team achieves it every year. This begs the question, what exactly is a dynasty? The word gets thrown around a fair bit, but what really makes one? Looking back at some of the past few premierships.


The Western Bulldogs of 2016 won a premiership from 7th position to claim the holy grail, but it was just that... a premiership. In 2015, they enjoyed a solid season and made a finals appearance, but were bundled out in the first week by Adelaide, and subsequently missed the eight in 2017 and 2018. So no, that is not a dynasty because it is just one single flag.

Looking back to the late nineties when North Melbourne and Adelaide won four premierships together (North in 1996 and 1999, Adelaide in 1997 and 1998). Particularly with the Kangaroos, they went through a sustained period of on-field dominance, playing in seven consecutive Preliminary Finals from 1994-2000, including two Grand Finals for three premierships.

However, due to the fact they only won two of possible three Grand Finals, it cannot be called a dynasty. A fantastic period yes, but a dynasty? No. Adelaide are even less an example, because although they won two remarkable premierships in a row despite being underdogs on both accounts, they finished 12th and 13th on either side of the flags (1996 and 1999). So while the back-to-back titles against unbackable odds was an incredible achievement, it is still not a dynasty.

Now, what can be considered a dynasty? For one, the Brisbane Lions of 2001-2004. Particularly for a non-Victorian team, to qualify in four consecutive Grand Finals, having to travel interstate every second week and still win three premierships in a row is the stuff of legends, and is still certainly the greatest three-peat of all time. Despite the fact they couldn't quite complete th four-peat in 2004, this is absolutely considered a dynasty. Not only did the Lions qualify for finals and Grand Finals, they actually won them and took their opportunities more often than not.

Geelong of 2007-2011 is another one, in five years they finished a home and away season either first or second, made the preliminary final on every occasion, making four Grand Finals and winning three. Despite not winning any of them consecutively, this is still a dynasty because they won three within a small timeframe. Hawthorn of 2011-2016 is the last of the recent dynasties. A heartbreaking three point loss in the Preliminary Final against Collingwood, backed up by four Grand Finals in a row for three flags in 2013-2015. This is the last true dynasty we have seen... until possibly now.


The Richmond Football Club, after finishing 13th in 2016, have come from seemingly nowhere to win two premierships since and if they are successful in this year's crazy season... will officially create their own dynasty. The flags coming in 2017 and 2019, they need just one more to claim it. A dynasty is lucky number three, if a club wins three premierships within a 4-7 year bracket, it is a dynasty. One or two is great, no

doubt... but it is not a truly sustained period of success. In reality, Richmond could have and should, be going for their fourth premiership in a row. They were the surprise packet in 2017 and 2019 they were continuing on... but 2018 they were truly the best team in the competition and the Preliminary Final loss to Collingwood was an absolute choke of the highest quality. But if they win their third flag in four years, it will officially enter the rare mould.

With a Qualifying Final battle against Brisbane, whom they boast a great record over, could be the first step in achieving that rare feat. Time will tell.
