It will be a fight to the finish to make the eight

Port Adelaide

Port Adelaide have been on top of the ladder the entire season, but that doesn't mean they have been the best. The Power have lost to top eight sides in Geelong, Brisbane and Saint Kilda and all of these losses were by big margins. Some of the Power's wins this season have been excellent like their triumph over Richmond, but others have not been entirely convincing. If it's going to be history in the making for the Power, they need to kick truly, play an unpredictable game style, and somehow ensure they aren't reliant on Charlie Dixon as their only target inside 50. They should win their remaining three matches to retain top spot and take out the minor premiership.

Brisbane Lions

The Brisbane Lions have been as good a team as any. They have been excellent inside 50 but their goal kicking has let them down. The Lions are 15th for effective disposals, which considering they have been dominant with gaining possession of the ball, this is very concerning. They have only lost to Richmond, Geelong and Hawthorn this season, however, some of their wins have been extremely close. If they cannot fix their goal kicking accuracy, they will be in some serious trouble come finals. The Lions like Port have an easy run home and should finish second on the ladder.

Geelong Cats

The first half of Geelong's season was very inconsistent as their wins were very close, while their loses to GWS, Carlton, West Coast and Collingwood were very poor performances. In the latter half of the season Geelong have shown much improvement and have been the real front runners for the premiership, beating Port, Brisbane and Saint Kilda by considerable margins. The height of their players has been their edge over teams and their key forward targets have also proved valuable. Geelong should win two of their next three matches to finish third or fourth on the ladder.

Richmond

Coming into this season Richmond were definitely the minor premiership favourites. However, loses to Hawthorn, Saint Kilda, Port Adelaide, GWS and a draw with Collingwood, saw them brought back to earth. While their wins to West Coast and Brisbane showed their true potential, it likely won't be enough to see them make the top 2. The Tigers should finish fourth, but a win against Geelong would see them secure third spot and a loss could see them drop out of the top 4.

West Coast Eagles

After a disappointing start to the Eagles' season, with losses to the Gold Coast Suns, Brisbane and Port Adelaide, West Coast won their next eight games straight, including beating Geelong. Since then they experienced a minor hiccup in their finals hopes last week after losing to Richmond. Their four games remaining against middle of the range sides will prove whether they are honestly

more than just premiership pretenders. They will make the eight, but their position is a bit up in the air, they should however, finish fifth.

Saint Kilda

Saint Kilda are a hard team to judge, they easily beat Port Adelaide and Richmond but Madison Mifsud-Ure lost to teams like North Melbourne and Fremantle. The Saints seem to not be able to win when it counts and buckle under the pressure of a close game, having lost four matches by under a goal. Nevertheless, other than their poor efforts against Geelong and Collingwood, Saint Kilda have competed hard in every contest and against every other team. Their unfortunate loses however will prove costly and with three tough matches remaining, Saint Kilda will likely fail to make the eight.

Collingwood

The Pies have been very inconsistent this season and have showcased some very poor performances against teams below them on the ladder. They don't seem to be playing with much confidence and based on their games so far it appears they are just pretenders. With a long injury list the Pies have really struggled to find their feet and have lacked effort in many contests. They have however been effective in their disposals and with games against Brisbane, Gold Coast Suns and Port Adelaide on the horizon the Pies need to give it their all. Wins against two of these teams would see them make the eight finishing sixth or seventh depending on their winning margins and other teams.

Melbourne

Other than their thrashing of Collingwood, Melbourne have simply been mediocre. They have lost to everyone above them on the ladder (minus the Pies), and have failed to make a significant impact in games. Despite Max Gawn's dominance in the ruck, the Demons are ranked 15th for clearances. Easy wins to Sydney, Fremantle and Essendon would see them stay in the eight. Come finals, if they start applying more pressure to their opponents, are able to win more ground balls then they might be in with a shot, but at this late stage they are not a premiership threat.

GWS Giants

GWS are a team you would have expected to see make finals, but after a very disappointing season. last years' runners-up are going to be lucky to even make the eight. While they have beaten Geelong, Collingwood and Richmond, they have not been dominant on the field and are 15th for inside 50s. A team that is a premiership contender needs to be able to get the ball into their attack, without this key component they will not be able to compete. Should GWS win comfortably against Carlton, Crows, Melbourne and the Saints then they will make the eight. It will, however, be very difficult given three of the teams they are playing against are also fighting to make the eight.

How will we remember season 2020?

The strangest season that Australian Rules Football has ever endured. It is a fair assessment to say that it has been the most unorthodox seasons of AFL football.

We are currently at the twig light stages of the home and away season as 14 rounds have been played in a shortened season of 18 rounds. The impact of COVID-19 as severely affected all aspects of life across the globe, including our great game. A much-shortened home and away season and shortened quarters by five minutes have been severe changes to the format that players, coaching staff, umpires and spectators have required adjusting to. However, the establishment of hubs in Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia, has been the most significant COVID influenced adjustment.

I believe that one of the greatest debacles of the season thus far was the situation of Victorian clubs being isolated to play in Victoria before the escalation of the COVID crisis. My interpretation was that the arrangement stirred a lot of emotions of football fanatics in the AFL realm. It is also reignited the "Victorian bias" debate, one of the most heated footy discussions that always seems to get swept under the rug. Many argued, including myself I may add; it is unfair for interstate teams to travel every second week interstate and Victorian clubs play in their home state week in, week out. The escalation of this fiery debate has been one of the highlights of the season off the field.

Off field debates and debacles occur in every season no matter the conditions. We footy enthusiasts are like moths to the flame when action on the field is taking place and that is what it is all about. The severe demise of the Adelaide Crows, remaining winless so far with 13 consecutive losses is one of the most whopping results to be seen. Adelaide have been a strong performing club since their establishment and their maiden wooden spoon in 2020 has been executed in poor style.

It has been competitive at the top end of the table as Port Adelaide, Brisbane, West Coast and Geelong are making their premiership bids. It will be intriguing to see who will be lifting the premiership at seasons end but I am more intrigued to see how the premiers of this season will be accepted into history. Will this season be revered as the season that did not matter or will it be one of the most important seasons our game has ever endured? The rise of prevalent young talents that will be the future of our game is something this strange season will be remembered for. The rise of number one draft pick, Matt Rowel in the early season, Izak Rankine, Jack Lukosius, Ben and Max King, Harris Andrews, Jack Steele and many more have injected excitement into our game. The breakout talents we have seen emerge in this COVID struct season has made this season detrimental to future of the AFL I strongly believe.

It is yet uncertain where the Grand Final will be staged at the conclusion of the season, but we do know that it will not be at the MCG. This is enormous; the MCG has been the main stage of the Grand Final for decades and to will this Grand Final played outside of Victoria influence seasons to come?

The AFL Grand Final Is up for grabs, with Western Australia, South Australia and Queensland eager to host. Each government has presented their argument to the AFL and argued why the biggest event on the AFL calendar should be staged in their state. A case can be made for each state, as all states have both positive and negative arguments. It is not a decision the AFL will take lightly, nor should it be. This very may well be the only opportunity for an interstate Grand Final, at least until the MCG's contract runs out in 2057. The AFL needs to consider every state's contribution to the 2020 season, the risks and precautions in place for COVID, and how the state will benefit and support the game. However, from a fans perspective, the atmosphere is another

While the AFL is set to make a public decision soon, the final decision may be different come October. COVID is an unpredictable variable and states could be forced to pull out, or at the very least provide an unattractive pitch. If COVID cases spike, COVID restrictions are the driving factor for the AFL's decision. However, first let's focus on what the states can do for the game. Western Australia and South Australia produce similar pitches, while Queensland offer a different approach got hosting privileges.

Queensland is a rugby state. For fifteen years I grew up a Brisbane Lions fan while my friends grew up as Broncos fans. The state only had the one team until 2009, and the Gold Coast Suns have not truly showed promise until this year. Not once have they made the finals, while the Lions made their first finals appearance last year after a ten year drought. Not to mention, the support base is undependable without experiencing success. Therefore, hosting the AFL Grand Final could be a step in the right direction for advertising the game. Queensland does not offer the same 'footy-fanatic' experience as WA, SA and Victoria, but it certainly presents the opportunity to grow the game.


South Australia and Western Australia are states with deep-rooted football history. Hosting the Grand Final in either state would bring the game to die-hard football fans to experience the magnitude of the day. The support base for both home teams in each state guarantees numbers for the Grand Final to create an exciting atmosphere. Atmosphere is everything. It contributes to the feel of the day. For a player, there is nothing like hearing the roar of the crowd as you run out on the field. I imagine that feeling is only heightened running out to play for the premiership. It is an experience that every AFL player who earns the opportunity to live it deserves. Crowd capacity is another factor which will influence the AFL's decision. Certainly, the state which is in the best position to offer more spectators will have a major edge. COVID restrictions have everything to do with this.

While atmosphere and opportunity are strong arguments to make, the AFL will be determined to make the smartest 'COVID safe' decision. Which state has the best facilities to provide player and coaching staff with safe accommodation, transport and training grounds? Which state offers safe COVID practices for spectators? We can speculate and argue about where the 2020 Grand Final will be held this year. Either way the AFL will make the decision which best suits the game, players and spectators.

Over and Unders: Top three rated current AFL players

Overrated #3: Kurt Tippett (Adelaide & Sydney)

Often thought of as a dominant forward of the competition... why? This was a case where a player has a breakout season very early in their career, and perhaps unrealistic expectations cloud them for the remainder of their football life. Tippett hardly ever fired when truly needed, played in two Grand Finals and had little impact in both, only kicked over 50 goals in a year once, in his second season. Quite simply, he was a confidence player. If he kicked a goal in the first quarter, he would have a good game. If he didn't, expect no more than 10 touches and no goals. The only final he ever truly dominated was the 2012 Preliminary Final against Hawthorn, kicking four goals as the best forward in a losing game.

Overrated #2: Dale Thomas (Collingwood & Carlton)

Some were calling Dale Thomas one of the best players in the competition ten years ago. From 2010-2011, it is agreeable he was in the prime of his career, but he was hardly 'one of the best'. While Daisy showed signs of excellence, he was assisted by playing in a successful team. The truth is, Thomas was sporadic on the field, he would kick a miracle goal from the boundary line and not do much else. His run and chase was impressive, but his distribution was often average for AFL standard. Great for a highlight reel, but was far from elite. The Collingwood 2010 flag was his best season. The subsequent move to Carlton was majorly disappointing.

Overrated #1: Cyril Rioli (Hawthorn)

Very talented, silky, smooth and a beautifully lethal left foot kick... but sporadic. Many argue Cyril won Grand Finals off his own boot... He didn't. 2015 was the only Grand Final he dominated, gathering 18 possessions, two goals and taking home the Norm Smith medal. 2008 he had good moments and kicked goals, but hardly 'won the day'. 2013 he was relatively quiet and 2014 he was returning from injury and made hardly any influence on the result. Rioli was an extraordinarily gifted player, but did not perform at his peak week in, week out. He had many quiet games and would go unsighted throughout a lot of the home and away season, the odd miracle goal would often camouflage that. Eddie Betts, Jeff Farmer and Stephen Milne were more consistent.

Underrated #3: Shane Parker (Fremantle)

Is hardly ever mentioned, but was certainly be one of the best defenders during the 2000s, often in the shadows of defenders such as Dustin Fletcher, Ben Hart and Darryl White. Tough to quell over head, agile, skilful, tough and quick, Parker was able to nullify some of the best forwards in the competition, ie. David Neitz, Michael O'Loughlin and Jeff Farmer with his solid body and marking prowess. Played 238 games, but unfortunately did not have much on field success, playing just four finals.


Over and Unders: Top three rated current AFL players

Underrated #2: Warren Tredrea (Port Adelaide)

At his best during the 2000s, Tredders was right up there in the Richardson, Rocca, Pavlich mould. An imposing figure without unbelievable strength over head, remarkable athleticism on the ground for his height and a long, powerful kick. Potentially playing for the smaller of two South Australian clubs worked against him, but Daniel Emilio Amoto the 2004 premiership captain still kicked over 50 goals on five occasions. Certainly one of the most underrated forwards of the last 20 years.

Underrated #1: Tyson Edwards (Adelaide)

321 games sees Edwards sitting second for all time Crow games behind only Andrew McLeod. Throughout his 16 season career, a showdown medal in 2006 is the only personal accolade to show for his outstanding career. What he lacked in pace he made up for in skill. A penetrating, elite kick on both right and left foot saw him at the very top-class of the AFL throughout the 2000s. His ability to kick goals as a midfielder also put him into a rare category. In the shadow of Andrew McLeod, Ben Hart, Mark Ricciuto, Scott Thompson and Simon Goodwin for the bulk of his career may have had something to do with his lack of recognition. But he has something some of the greatest players in the games history do not have; a premiership medallion... two of them in fact.

Why we play

What gives a man meaning is his pursuit of a goal. It is somewhat cliché to say the "journey is more important than the destination," but it is also true. Think about it like a game. When you're trying to achieve something, you overcome challenging situations which require new ways of thinking and acting. You destroy your old self to transform into a redefined and enlightened version of yourself. It is this transformation that makes he journey or aim for a higher good more valuable than actually achieving that goal.



But, what happens after you achieve that goal? Maybe you feel a sense of ease and satisfaction from all your hard work. Maybe you feel content. Maybe you feel happy – but only momentarily. You see, there is a misconception between happiness and meaning. Happiness is a reward, where meaning is a state. Since the catastrophes of the 20th century, which saw the most evil side of humanity, that of the Soviet Union, Nazi Germany and Maoist China, populations around the world, almost as a defense mechanism against those atrocious times, have fallen prey to the pursuit of happiness instead of the pursuit for meaning. Happiness fails to sustain us through the suffering of life, where meaning helps carry the load we voluntarily decide to bear.

How does this relate to footy then? Well, let's say you want to win the Best and Fairest medal. You first acknowledge that you have to overcome certain weaknesses and transform into a better player. Except, what exactly does 'transform into a better player' mean? Firstly, it means you have to admit that you are not who you could be. That's judgement. Secondly, it means that you accept the fact that you could fail, and that it's very likely you will. That's acceptance. Unite these two ideas together and you have created a dangerous journey uphill that will give you that necessary sense of meaning in what the pessimists call a meaningless world. And, so, as a footy player, or any athlete for that matter, you will experience most of your hope and joy (happiness) by pursuing your goals, and not, generally speaking, by attaining them.

Dustin Martin, one of the greatest to ever play the game, spoke out in 2019 about his battle with anxiety and depression which began in 2018. To The Age, he said, "I had everything I wanted and everything I dreamt of, but I didn't feel fulfilled or happy." After speaking out about his mental health, Martin explained how "it was the small guided steps," like "reading books in [his] spare time" that "made [him] realise what [was] important in life." This scenario seems to be a common situation that athletes find themselves in.

They achieve what they set out to do, experience that sense of happiness, and then expect it to fulfil their life thereon. It is something that we should be aware of as individuals, all of whom have our own goals and paths in life. But, it's important to understand that life itself isn't a game. It's a series of games. And, sometimes, you have to know how it feels to lose, in order to appreciate what you have achieved.

Stop and Go

In the last few years, Australian Football has taken a frightening path towards becoming a stop-and-go game. One could argue that it has always been a type of game that is centered around winning stoppages and controlling possession through marks. But, when you think of the term 'footy,' and maybe even when you try to describe the sport to an unfamiliar spectator, what comes to mind is the excitement, speed and aggressiveness associated with what some would call 'a dangerous sport.'

When we think of footy, we don't think of stoppages. We think of counter-attacking football, players with elite speed, teams with incredible ball movement; but, most especially, we think of goals.

The worry for fans of footy is whether the AFL is trying to mould Australia's national sport into a replica of American Football. The NFL (National Football League) is one of the most watched sports in the world and millions of people tune in to the Super Bowl on TV every year. On that same day, some of the world's biggest brands sponsor the event and pay millions of dollars for a single commercial during the breaks. The half-time show alone is enough for the event to attract global attention, especially on social media platforms like Twitter and YouTube. From the AFL's perspective, this is something that Australia should be aiming towards. In this case, they are right. But it is a fine line between global exposure and the ruin of a national sport.

As mentioned before, footy is a unique sport in the sense that it asks players to put themselves on the line for their team's success (without protective gear). However, the sport has begun to ask players to do something else; that is, play competitively, but control your aggression. As a player, it's difficult to enforce that type of message into your performance. Aggression is an important part of this sport, and the constant rule changes to 'protect' players seems to be doing more harm to the game than good.

Disregarding this season, the amount of goals scored in each game has been dropping dramatically. In 2018, the AFL's average scores were the lowest ever seen for 52 years (83.1 points per game). Unless it's a total blowout, you won't see a game where both teams kick 20 goals in a competitive match of footy. Gone are those days. Instead, now it's considered lucky if a single game can consist of 20 goals (in total).

With this in mind, it's important that we recognize what a 'stop-and-go' style of play could do to he game. Alas, these continuing reinforcements of 'protective footy' rules do two things: slow down the pace of the game by rewarding more free kicks, resulting in less goals; and, most concerningly, pushes us closer towards a mimic of American-style Football.




Payneham Norwood Union 9.13 (67) defeated Adelaide University 8.9 (57)

Woodville South showed encouraging signs for the 2021 season, when they














