Rebuilding stage for Adelaide Crows

The Crows, who attained their first win of the season against Hawthorn last week, showed a glimpse of the prideful footy that we've seen them play in the past. Crows play their best when they show that type of aggression like they did, and most importantly, when they start to dominate clearances. However, it is no mystery that both the Crows and Hawks are undergoing a rebuild stage with their sights keen on the AFL Draft.

Depending if the Crows trade or not, they will get this year's first pick in the draft. However, they probably could not have chosen a worst year to get it. Although South Australian football has continued, other states, like Victoria and New South Wales, have cancelled their local and state competitions. That means the Crows will have a limited choice of players to consider, and will probably have to use their pick to fill in a hole in their squad, rather than choosing the most promising and talented player.

As for trades and transfers, the Crows will probably lose a few more key players. Although the Tex has not been in the best form, he is still an important player for the Crows who acts as the glue of their forward line. Brad Crouch, on the other hand, is on the ropes. No one questions the fact that he is a star midfielder, but I think he's done all he can at the Crows, and it would be a waste of talent for the young gun to remain with Adelaide through a rebuilding phase. And, as Crouch will be a restricted free agent, the Crows could end up being compensated with the second pick in the draft too. Also, it seems Rory Atkins has already expressed his interest in free agency, adding to the list of key players the Crows will lose. But, to reiterate, these are, or will be, important moves for the Crows in their rebuilding stage.

Having debuted the most number of players for any team this year, the Crows have shown that their top priority is to advance youth players to the first team for experience and improvement. Players like Will Hamill, Lachlan Scholl, Shane McAdam, Andy McPherson and Harry Schoenberg are sure to be names that we will see in a few years when the Crows grow passed this rebuilding stage. To add to this, the Crows are looking at Jackson Hatley from the Giants, who seems to be a young midfielder that isn't getting any game time in Sydney.

This will definitely remain a theme through the post-season, as the Crows aim to make their youth the core of the team. As for the rest of this season, I think Adelaide can muster one more win. It won't come easy, but it's crucial for the confidence of the players, and will give fans something to be happy about for this dreadful season.

Is the Brownlow Medal really the best individual honour?

The Brownlow Medal is AFL's night of all nights. It has all the glitz and glamour of a red carpet event as players, partners, AFL staff, coaches, and former winners come together to celebrate. As viewers we speculate, perhaps placing bets between families and friends, about who will take out the medal. We judge every dress that walks down the red carpet, vocalising our opinions to those watching with us. Most of all, it is a night to reflect on the season that was and kicking off the excitement of Grand Final week.

However, while we hype up the night and the event is celebrated in style, is it a true reflection of who played the most consistent and compelling season? The Brownlow medal is an award presented to a player who received the most votes according to the umpires. While the umpires are a critical part of the game, are they necessarily the best people to determine the best player for the season? The field umpires are heavily involved in the game, but it is not their job to study other teams and players. Their opinions and voting decisions are dictated only by what they see, which you can argue is not the most credible voting source. Umpires are focused on enforcing the rules of the game, and even then they don't get it right 100 per cent of the time.

It is a fair argument to suggest that coaches and players are in a better position to determine the most valuable player of the season. Sure, they are involved in how the game unfolds, and more aware of the oppositions movements. But, if anything, it is the extensive analysis that coaches and players do before, during and after that puts them in the best position.

Players and coaches awards already exist. The Leigh Matthews Trophy and the AFL Coaches Association Champion Player of the Year are determined by the players and coaches respectively. So why is the Brownlow Medal considered the AFL's highest individual honour? As a player, I imagine being voted by your peers and expert coaching staff throughout the AFL would feel like a greater achievement. If the same player won all three awards every year then this argument is pointless, but the awards often have different results. For example, in the past 20 years, the Brownlow medallist winner/s and the Leigh Matthews Trophy winner were different (in the same season) 11 times. The differing results certainly suggest different approaches in determining the AFL's most valuable player.

Either way the Brownlow Medal is an AFL tradition that will evolve with our game, and the prestige of the night cannot be argued, even if it is influenced. It is a night which celebrates the best players of our game, while also including the legends of old. As the 2020 season draws closer to finals, the Brownlow Medal predictions will start firing up. It will certainly be a Brownlow to remember as COVID will change the dynamic of the night.

Still reason to fly as 1 in 21

On the eve of Round One 2020, it was assumed Adelaide would endure a difficult season, but to be 1-13 with only three games remaining was far the expectations of the football world. Albeit a young and emerging club, the Crows have suffered their lowest fall in club history. Unless they win the next three games against Greater Western Sydney, Carlton and Richmond, and North Melbourne continue losing, they will almost certainly miss the finals for a record-equalling third consecutive season, and also 'win' their maiden wooden spoon.

With up and coming, young talent in Darcy Fogarty, Elliott Himmelberg, Fischer McAsey, Harry Shoenberg, Lachlan Murphy, Tyson Stengle, Riley O'Brien and Shane McAdam expected to play major minutes this season. As well as retaining a strong nucleus of experienced players in the Crouch brothers, Bryce Gibbs, Daniel Talia, David Mackay, Luke Brown, Rory Sloane, Taylor Walker and Tom Lynch, it was not unrealistic for Adelaide fans to expect a competitive side, certainly capable of producing more than one win. It is now obvious, rookie coach Matthew Nicks has a lot of shuffling to do over the pre-season.

While the Crows had a well-known 'clean out' last year with the departures of Andy Otten, Eddie Betts, Josh Jenkins, Richard Douglas, Sam Jacobs and the like, it seems this may need to happen again. Bryce Gibbs and David Mackay both appear to be in their final seasons, expected to be shown the door. Brad Crouch seems more likely to seek a move to Victoria than not, but the Crows should be aiming to keep Matt, who struggles to avoid the 'trade-talk.' While Talia and Sloane are still valuable enough in their positions and impact on the team, and it is likely Tom Lynch will return for 2021, Taylor Walker is the sentimental one.

While no one can deny the contribution Walker has made for Adelaide both on and off the field, captaining the team through its darkest time of 2015 with the tragic death of Phil Walsh, and two years later being just the second man in club history to captain them into a Grand Final, it seems the best has passed for Tex. While he is the heart and soul for Adelaide, it is not about Walker anymore, he is realistically not going to be part of the Crows next premiership, which is not a strong prospect for at least 4-8 years. Where it is different in respect to Talia and Sloane, Walker is unfortunately taking the position away from either Darcy Fogarty or Elliot Himmelberg, who over the next decade are going to be the central of Adelaide's attack, along with Murphy and Stengle.

While Fogarty and Himmelberg are still developing, they need to be given maximum game time for hands-on experience to learn their craft and create chemistry between one another. While it seems unlikely at this stage, the two could eventually form a dynamic duo similar to that of a

Hawthorn 'Franklin-Roughead', capable of kicking 40-80 goals per season each. This cannot be done if Taylor Walker is in the way, either physically taking their spot or being seen by midfielders and defenders as the 'go-to-man'. A prime example of where this works is last season's dropping and eventual trading of Sam Jacobs, who for years was Adelaide's lead ruckman. The club finally made the decision to play Riley O'Brien instead, which has paid dividends and he is now beginning to flourish.

Adelaide has historically had a difficult time moving on, ten years ago they continued to play the ageing likes of Andrew McLeod, Brett Burton, Simon Goodwin and Tyson Edwards over the young Daniel Talia, Patrick Dangerfield and Rory Sloane types, this was part of the reason they endured 11th and 14th finishes in 2010-2011. They waited too long and were subsequently forced to field a side of 18 year old's with no experience, after those older players all retired at the same time, and they had not previously tried the young talent evenly with consistent pace.

Adelaide are in a tough spot now, part of that is again holding on to those older players too long, then departing them at once and being forced to field too many younger players all at once without even progression. Next season, Matthew Nicks will surely need to see his side win significantly more games, or else he too could be in a spot of bother. As long as Crows fans can see the younger players out there, with a decent nucleuse of experience in the correct places, there is still reason to fly as one.

We almost witnessed nightmare results for Port Adelaide, Geelong and West Coast. While all three teams are in a safe spot to play finals, losing games you are expected to win is crushing for momentum. West Coast have the best argument for their 12-point win; GWS are a threat when they play their best footy, but their inconsistency is why they sit at 11th. However, Port Adelaide and Geelong played 15th and 18th respectively. Geelong managed to put the crows away in the fourth quarter to win comfortably by 28 points. Yet, the third quarter margin was only 9 points in Geelong's favour. Port Adelaide, on the other hand, had to fight until the final siren. Hawthorn had transformed their on-field behaviour by taking on their 'unsociable' label from their glory days, which proved a task for ladder leaders Port. Port only just escaped from a loss to the Hawks after a combined effort from Scott Lycett, Zak Butters and Ollie Wines to produce a goal in the final two minutes.

The teams at the top of the table are tasked with finishing off their season strongly against teams sitting comfortably below them. All four teams are facing games over the final five rounds which they are expected to win, especially with a bye in the next two weeks to recover.

Meanwhile, teams hovering around the eight spot cut-off are facing a tough battle over the coming weeks. Desperation is the key to securing those final spots up for grabs. Who can string together consistent performances, and who wants it more? Also, who deserves to be there come finals? From 6th position to 11th, the battle for top eight is tight; only two games separate 6th from 11th. St Kilda, Western Bulldogs, Collingwood, Melbourne, Carlton and GWS are the six clubs hanging closely around the top eight cut-off. During the final home and away rounds these clubs need to prove why they should play finals football.

Out of all six teams, St Kilda deserve a spot the most. After finishing 14th last year, they have taken on board new coaching leadership and produced a fresh style of football. The Saints are exciting to watch and have developed brilliantly under Brett Ratten, especially young players like Max King.
