## The top 3

### Port Adelaide

Having occupied the top of the ladder for the entire season, the Power have shown that the system of footy they lay is good enough to beat any team. For years, Port's consistency was in question, but now they have finally shown their rhythm and form throughout the season.

Port are most effective when they dictate the play and control the tempo against other teams.

When the ball is trapped into their forward half, almost no team can break through that wall of defence. However, their entire game relies on their forwards. When players like Charlie Dixon or Robbie Gray are double or even triple teamed, the Power find it difficult to overcome these obstacles and fall into inefficiency inside 50. If Port can continue to get rewards for their efforts, then the team can feed off of that momentum and beat anyone. The real worry for Port is making sure their forwards remain active and efficient enough for their system of play to keep intact.

### Brisbane Lions

There's not much to criticise about the Brisbane Lions considering their extremely strong form and consistency this season too. Their breakout year came last season, but this year the Lions have taken a giant leap in the league by securing a top 2 position on the ladder throughout most of the season. Their energy and pressure is unmatched, and their results against top 8 teams has been more than successful. The only reason to doubt whether this team can win the Premiership is by focusing on the age of their players. Compared to West Coast and Richmond, who won the last two Grand Finals, the Lions have a considerably younger team. But it seems that their passion and aggression stems through the fearlessness and discipline of their youth players, accompanied by the guidance of some veteran teammates. Maybe the only real concern is their adaptability. If a team can match or even overcome the pressure of Brisbane, do the Lions have other ways in which they can play their attacking style of footy?

### Richmond

Now that most of Richmond's injury woes have been healed, they're now one of the most dangerous teams in the league. Their defense is impossible to break through, and their midfield remains lethal. Although Dustin Martin and Tom Lynch haven't had an exceptional season, like we've seen them have before, the entire Tigers team seems to be the most balanced in the league, with an even spread of disposals among players. Instead of having one or two players that rack up 30+ disposals, Richmond players share the ball with all their teammates and play as one single unit. The biggest downfall to having one of the best defenses in the league seems to be scoring goals for the Tigers. Most of Richmond's wins this year have come from scoring 70 points or less, keeping teams goalless in multiple quarters. However, it seems that when teams score just 80 or more points against them, the Tigers really struggle to match their opponents scoring efforts. If Richmond can continue to keep teams below 6-7 goals in a match, chances are they'll win the Premiership. But against teams like Brisbane and Port, conceding goals just seems to be a given.

## Rebuilding stage for Adelaide Crows

The Crows, who attained their first win of the season against Hawthorn last week, showed a glimpse of the prideful footy that we've seen them play in the past. However, it is no mystery that both the Crows and Hawks are undergoing a rebuild stage with their sights keen on the AFL Draft.

Depending if the Crows trade or not, they will get this year's first pick in the draft. However, they probably could not have chosen a worst year to get it. Although South Australian football has continued, other states, like Victoria and New South Wales, have cancelled their local and state competitions. That means the Crows will have a limited choice of players to consider, and will probably have to use their pick to fill in a hole in their squad, rather than choosing the most promising and talented player.

As for trades and transfers, the Crows will probably lose a few more key players. Although the Tex has not been in the best form, he is still an important player for the Crows who acts as the glue of their forward line. Brad Crouch, on the other hand, is on the ropes. No one questions the fact that he is a star midfielder, but I think he's done all he can at the Crows, and it would be a waste of talent for the young gun to remain with Adelaide through a rebuilding phase. And, as Crouch will be a restricted free agent, the Crows could end up being compensated with the second pick in the draft too. Also, it seems Rory Atkins has already expressed his interest in free agency, adding to the list of key players the Crows will lose. But, to reiterate, these are, or will be, important moves for the Crows in their rebuilding stage.

Having debuted the most number of players for any team this year, the Crows have shown that their top priority is to advance youth players to the first team for experience and improvement. Players like Will Hamill, Lachlan Scholl, Shane McAdam, Andy McPherson and Harry Schoenberg are sure to be names that we will see in a few years when the Crows grow passed this rebuilding stage. To add to this, the Crows are looking at Jackson Hatelly from the Giants, who seems to be a young midfielder that isn't getting any game time in Sydney.

This will definitely remain a theme through the post-season, as the Crows aim to make their youth the core of the team. As for the rest of this season, I think Adelaide can muster one more win. It won't come easy, but it's crucial for the confidence of the players, and will give fans something to be happy about for this dreadful season.

# Amato's 5th Quarter

## All good things must come to an end. Yes...even you Hawthorn

The Hawthorn Football Club, are now for the first time in almost two decades, one of the laughing stocks of the AFL. Think back to just five years ago when they defeated the West Coast Eagles by eight goals in the 2015 Grand Final, completing their three-peat... it seemed nothing could ever bring them down. They would be at the top forever.

Since then however, they have seen the moving on or retirements of some of their greatest players and premiership heroes; Bradley Hill, Brian Lake, Cyril Rioli, David Hale, Luke Hodge, Jarryd Roughead, Jordan Lewis Sam Mitchell and several others. Since their third consecutive premiership, they have missed the finals three of the last four seasons and are now sitting third bottom with just four wins, their lowest tally since Alastair Clarkson's first season at the helm in 2005. A prime of example of 'all good things must come to an end.'

After a promising 3-1 start to this abnormal 2020 season, Alastair Clarkson seemed to be getting the very best out of this average Hawthorn side, but since then the club has conjured just one win from its previous eleven attempts and now sit 16th and just one win ahead of wooden spoon contenders North Melbourne and Adelaide.

Nothing seems to have worked for the Hawks this season, their midfield doesn't gel at all. With Tom Mitchell still gathering possessions, but not having much impact on the result, James Worpel and Jaegar O'Meara not necessarily declining, but not advancing their games to any great lengths and a forward line that seems to be missing the presence of Jarryd Roughead, with the major goal kicker being Jack Gunston with 27, the next highest being Chad Wingard with only 18. The Hawks as a unit are 12th or lower per game for scores disposals, tackles, inside 50s, clearances and marks... so they struggle to get the ball and when they use it, rarely does it result in sufficient scoring.

It seems the club tried to re-emulate what they did a decade ago, by recruiting mature-age talent from other clubs. Ben McEvoy, Brian Lake, David Hale Shaun Burgoyne, Jack Gunston, Josh Gibson and the like all played major parts in their premiership success. As a football club you don't always get it right, but what have the acquisitions of Chad Wingard, Jaegar O'Meara, Jarman Impey, Jonathon Patton and Tom Scully to advance their premiership credentials? While Impey has been solid, and the injury factor with Patton can be a valid excuse, the second attempt at recycling players has failed thus far. Alastair Clarkson seems to be frustrated at his team's inability to remain competitive for long enough, taking shots at the opposition game plans in his press conferences. They were certainly good enough to defeat your club, Clarko?

## Adaptive coaching does not equal soft coaching

I was sitting in a coffee shop last Friday morning, reading the sports section of the paper, before coming across an article by Kane Cornes. In his words: “soft bosses who give in to precious players don’t succeed in football”. He believes AFL coaches need “to embrace old school toughness”.

Kane Cornes started his career in 2001 at Port Adelaide. He played against some of the toughest teams in the early 2000s, with coaches to match their ruthless approach. However, we are not in the early 2000’s anymore and the coach-player relationship has evolved. Of course there needs to be a level of toughness. Coaches, more than ever, need to earn the respect of the players to get results. Yet, reviving old school coaching techniques will only cause coaches to lose their players and produce unfavourable results.

Social media is an overwhelming influence in the modern world as its design can cause mental health problems for any of us. In particular, people like AFL players who are in the public eye can experience this effect even more. The constant comments and opinions from fans, former players, coaches and media personnel can become too much for today’s players. It is not difficult to understand why. It was much easier to tune out others opinions of your team and performance when platforms like Facebook, Instagram and Twitter did not exist.

Players from the 2000s era have taught us exactly why old school coaching techniques are no longer effect on modern playing groups. Michael Voss, Nathan Buckley, Justin Leppitsch and Damien Hardwick are prime examples of the importance of evolving with the ‘times’. Nathan Buckley and Damien Hardwick are proof of the difference coaching techniques make on team performance.

Nathan Buckley was one of the toughest leaders in the late 90s and early 2000s era. His opponents and teammates have all commented on his intensity and focus as a player. When he was named Senior Coach of the Collingwood Football Club, Buckley used the same mentality. However, the response from his players was underwhelming and worrying for Collingwood fans. Today, coaches are tasked with the responsibility to create connections and build relationships with their players, while also gaining their respect. Nathan Buckley focused more on his empathy as a coach to make that connection with his players and the results speak for themselves. Even though they have not won a premiership, they made the decider in 2018 and have been a competitive finals side for a few years now.

Damien Hardwick is another successful example of this new, modern-day coaching mentality. He has led his Richmond team to two premierships in the last three seasons and has addressed


### PRELIMINARY FINAL


