



## Adelaide Crows v GWS Sydney

Adelaide Oval - 5.40pm (Tuesday) September 8th



### A Giant victory will prove the Hawk win was no fluke for buoyant Crows

Adelaide will go into Tuesday's match against the Giants full of confidence after securing their maiden win for 2020 with a five goal triumph over Hawthorn. The Crows led from go to whoa and would have won by more, if it weren't for inaccurate kicking in front of goal in the first quarter.

Adelaide dominated the midfield with Reilly O'Brien's tap work giving the Crows midfielders first use. Ben Keays (22 disposals, eight score involvements) played his best game in the tricolours, with excellent support provided by the Crouch brothers. Up forward Tyson Stengle was electric, while Fogarty, Jones, Schoenberg and Walker all kicked two goals apiece.

GWS also found some form in their big win over Fremantle in Perth last weekend to keep them in touch of the Top 8 – with a game in hand. Playing just his second AFL match, Jake Riccardi was outstanding for the Giants, kicking four goals and taking nine marks, after 2 goals and 10 marks in his debut match the previous week. Defender Lachie Whitfield (31 disposals, nine intercept possessions) was BOG for the Giants. Tim Taranto (25 disposals, five clearances) and Steve Coniglio (24 disposals, three clearances) dominated the midfield to prevent the Dockers from going inside 50.

The fixturing should favour the Crows, with Adelaide playing yet another Tuesday twilight match – their third consecutive match in Adelaide, while GWS have had to play twice in Perth, fly back to Queensland to play Carlton, before coming to Adelaide on a five day break.

The Giants injury list is getting shorter with Phil Davis a chance to shake off his knee trouble to provide the backline with some stability. Josh Kelly will be hoping to get back on the field after his nasty collision with Shane Mumford's knee in the win over Fremantle. For Adelaide Andrew McPherson will be hoping he has overcome his latest hamstring setback, while Wayne Milera's foot injury is lingering and he may not return until 2021.

Four South Australians are in the Giants' squad – though possibly none will be playing on Tuesday due to form and injury. Three are former Crows players - AFL Crows Phil Davis (St Peter's College) and Sam Jacobs (Ardrossan), along with former Crows SANFL top up player Tom Hutchesson (Millicent). Jackson Hately (Trinity College) was drafted by GWS and will be looking to add to his tally of 12 games as we approach the business end of the season. Adelaide were impressive in their win over Hawthorn, but it was likely a case of the struggling Hawks simply making the Crows look good. The finals bound Giants will provide a far greater challenge for the Crows and have far more to play for than the hapless Hawks. **Giants by 13-24 points**

## North Melbourne v Port Adelaide



**Metricon Stadium - 5.40pm (Saturday)**

### Power set for a percentage booster against an insipid Roos outfit

Port Adelaide will be looking to strengthen its hold on top spot on the ladder when it takes on North Melbourne on Saturday night. The Power last week defeated Sydney by 26-points thanks to a four goal to zip second quarter which took the game away from the Swans. Robbie Gray was the catalyst, having his best game for the season and doing most of his work in the first half when the game was there to be won. Gray in the first quarter picked up 11 disposals, two goals and a goal assist before going on to have 19 disposals by half-time when Port Adelaide led by 32-points.

The Swans hit back in the second half, controlling large parts of the third quarter and the early stages of the last. They reduced the margin to three goals midway through the final term, but Port Adelaide were good enough to weather the storm, with goals to Zak Butters and Justin Westhoff ending any chance of a Sydney comeback.

Port Adelaide were boosted by the returns of Connor Rozee (heel), Ryan Burton (hamstring) and Todd Marshall (finger) as the squad is now close to full strength. Rozee had his moments and seemed to be moving free of pain and Burton definitely didn't have his best outing but will be better for the run. Todd Marshall didn't kick a goal and looking at the stats (seven disposals, two tackles and one mark) you'd probably say he had a quiet day, but the effect having him in the team has on Charlie Dixon cannot be understated.

In the eight games Dixon has played alongside Marshall this season, he has kicked 20 goals but in the five games without Marshall, he only managed seven. Simply put, having Marshall in the team provides another option for Port inside 50, dragging defenders away from Dixon and making Port's forward 50 entries less predictable for the opposition. The goals will come for Marshall but just having him out there is a win in itself for the Power.

North Melbourne come into Saturday's match off the back of its worst performance of 2020. The Roos were thrashed by 63-points by a Gold Coast side that despite showing some good signs of improvement this year, hadn't won any of its previous six matches. North managed just four marks inside 50 from its 37 entries. It scored from just 22% of these while at the other end of the field, Gold Coast scored from 69% of its 45 entries and took 15 marks inside the arc.

Kicking a winning score has been a serious issue over the last four games with the Roos averaging just 37.5 points per game in that period. Their two main targets inside 50 are Nick Larkey and Cam Zurhaar and in the last eight quarters of football, they have combined for just one goal. Players such as Mason Wood, Tristan Xerri and Bailey Scott have hit the scoreboard at times but realistically, the Roos forward mix is just not up to AFL standard, especially without Ben Brown.

The Kangaroos midfield has seen a significant shift in recent weeks with Rhyce Shaw opting to get midfield time into younger players such as Luke McDonald, Luke Davies-Uniacke and Jy Simpkin. While there have been some promising signs at stages from these younger players, they were badly beat up by the Suns midfield and were smashed in contested ball (-18) and clearances (-16). North's injuries cannot be understated and are a big part of why it has struggled so much in recent weeks. Players such as Brown, Ben Cunnington and Jack Ziebell are all key parts of the North side, while Curtis Taylor and Tarryn Thomas are also in the best 22 and bring some much needed class.

North Melbourne should be up for the fight and put in a much better performance than last week's insipid showing but it's hard to see this game being anything but a percentage-boosting win for the Power. **Port Adelaide by 37-48 points**

Central District's sit bottom and Norwood should easily claim the two points, especially after their big win last week against the ladder leaders. That win was the last time they won a match and they will be looking to have a similar performance this weekend. The Bloods haven't won at Glenelg since Round seven 2015 and I think they will have to wait a little longer for the next win there, with the Bays being too strong at home.



### Saint Kilda

Hosting the Grand Final in either state would bring the game to die-hard football fans to experience the magnitude of the day. The support base for both home teams in each state guarantees numbers for the Grand Final to create an exciting atmosphere. Atmosphere is everything. It contributes to the feel of the day. For a player, there is nothing like hearing the roar of the crowd as you run out on the field. I imagine that feeling is only heightened running out to play for the premiership. It is an experience that every AFL player who earns the opportunity to live it deserves. Crowd capacity is another factor which will influence the AFL's decision. Certainly, the state which is in the best position to offer more spectators will have a major edge. COVID restrictions have everything to do with this.

While atmosphere and opportunity are strong arguments to make, the AFL will be determined to make the smartest 'COVID safe' decision. Which state has the best facilities to provide player and coaching staff with safe accommodation, transport and training grounds? Which state offers safe COVID practices for spectators? We can speculate and argue about where the 2020 Grand Final will be held this year. Either way the AFL will make the decision which best suits the game, players and spectators.

## Over and Unders: Top three rated current AFL players

### Overrated #3: Kurt Tippett (Adelaide & Sydney)

Often thought of as a dominant forward of the competition... why? This was a case where a player has a breakout season very early in their career, and perhaps unrealistic expectations cloud them for the remainder of their football life. Tippett hardly ever fired when truly needed, played in two Grand Finals and had little impact in both, only kicked over 50 goals in a year once, in his second season. Quite simply, he was a confidence player. If he kicked a goal in the first quarter, he would have a good game. If he didn't, expect no more than 10 touches and no goals. The only final he ever truly dominated was the 2012 Preliminary Final against Hawthorn, kicking four goals as the best forward in a losing game.

### Overrated #2: Dale Thomas (Collingwood & Carlton)

Some were calling Dale Thomas one of the best players in the competition ten years ago. From 2010-2011, it is agreeable he was in the prime of his career, but he was hardly 'one of the best'. While Daisy showed signs of excellence, he was assisted by playing in a successful team. The truth is, Thomas was sporadic on the field, he would kick a miracle goal from the boundary line and not do much else. His run and chase was impressive, but his distribution was often average for AFL standard. Great for a highlight reel, but was far from elite. The Collingwood 2010 flag was his best season. The subsequent move to Carlton was majorly disappointing.

### Overrated #1: Cyril Rioli (Hawthorn)

Very talented, silky, smooth and a beautifully lethal left foot kick... but sporadic. Many argue Cyril won Grand Finals off his own boot... He didn't. 2015 was the only Grand Final he dominated, gathering 18 possessions, two goals and taking home the Norm Smith medal. 2008 he had good moments and kicked goals, but hardly 'won the day'. 2013 he was relatively quiet and 2014 he was returning from injury and made hardly any influence on the result. Rioli was an extraordinarily gifted player, but did not perform at his peak week in, week out. He had many quiet games and would go unsighted throughout a lot of the home and away season, the odd miracle goal would often camouflage that. Eddie Betts, Jeff Farmer and Stephen Milne were more consistent.

### Underrated #3: Shane Parker (Fremantle)

Is hardly ever mentioned, but was certainly be one of the best defenders during the 2000s, often in the shadows of defenders such as Dustin Fletcher, Ben Hart and Darryl White. Tough to quell over head, agile, skilful, tough and quick, Parker was able to nullify some of the best forwards in the competition, ie. David Neitz, Michael O'Loughlin and Jeff Farmer with his solid body and marking prowess. Played 238 games, but unfortunately did not have much on field success, playing just four finals.

### Underrated #2: Warren Tredrea (Port Adelaide)



## Why we play

But, what happens after you achieve that goal? Maybe you feel a sense of ease and satisfaction from all your hard work. Maybe you feel content. Maybe you feel happy – but only momentarily. Unite these two ideas together and you have created a dangerous journey uphill that will give you that necessary sense of meaning in what the pessimists call a meaningless world. And, so, as a footy player, or any athlete for that matter, you will experience most of your hope and joy (happiness) by pursuing your goals, and not, generally speaking, by attaining them.

Dustin Martin, one of the greatest to ever play the game, spoke out in 2019 about his battle with anxiety and depression which began in 2018. To The Age, he said, “I had everything I wanted and everything I dreamt of, but I didn’t feel fulfilled or happy.” After speaking out about his mental health, Martin explained how “it was the small guided steps,” like “reading books in [his] spare time” that “made [him] realise what [was] important in life.” This scenario seems to be a common situation that athletes find themselves in.

They achieve what they set out to do, experience that sense of happiness, and then expect it to fulfil their life thereon. It is something that we should be aware of as individuals, all of whom have our own goals and paths in life. But, it’s important to understand that life itself isn’t a game. It’s a series of games. And, sometimes, you have to know how it feels to lose, in order to appreciate what you have achieved.

## Stop and Go

In the last few years, Australian Football has taken a frightening path towards becoming a stop-and-go game. One could argue that it has always been a type of game that is centered around winning stoppages and controlling possession through marks. But, when you think of the term 'footy,' and maybe even when you try to describe the sport to an unfamiliar spectator, what comes to mind is the excitement, speed and aggressiveness associated with what some would call 'a dangerous sport.'

When we think of footy, we don't think of stoppages. We think of counter-attacking football, players with elite speed, teams with incredible ball movement; but, most especially, we think of goals.

The worry for fans of footy is whether the AFL is trying to mould Australia's national sport into a replica of American Football. The NFL (National Football League) is one of the most watched sports in the world and millions of people tune in to the Super Bowl on TV every year. On that same day, some of the world's biggest brands sponsor the event and pay millions of dollars for a single commercial during the breaks. The half-time show alone is enough for the event to attract global attention, especially on social media platforms like Twitter and YouTube. From the AFL's perspective, this is something that Australia should be aiming towards. In this case, they are right. But it is a fine line between global exposure and the ruin of a national sport.

As mentioned before, footy is a unique sport in the sense that it asks players to put themselves on the line for their team's success (without protective gear). However, the sport has begun to ask players to do something else; that is, play competitively, but control your aggression. As a player, it's difficult to enforce that type of message into your performance. Aggression is an important part of this sport, and the constant rule changes to 'protect' players seems to be doing more harm to the game than good.

Disregarding this season, the amount of goals scored in each game has been dropping dramatically. In 2018, the AFL's average scores were the lowest ever seen for 52 years (83.1 points per game). Unless it's a total blowout, you won't see a game where both teams kick 20 goals in a competitive match of footy. Gone are those days. Instead, now it's considered lucky if a single game can consist of 20 goals (in total).

With this in mind, it's important that we recognize what a 'stop-and-go' style of play could do to the game. Alas, these continuing reinforcements of 'protective footy' rules do two things: slow down the pace of the game by rewarding more free kicks, resulting in less goals; and, most concerningly, pushes us closer towards a mimic of American-style Football.
