### **Carlton v Adelaide Crows**

# Crows look to continue purple patch against inconsistent Blues

After three consecutive home games and week-long breaks, Adelaide return to Metricon Stadium, off a five day break, to tackle Carlton in their penultimate match for 2020. The Crows will enter the game full of confidence after back to back wins, firstly against a struggling Hawthorn, but more impressively their 12 point win on Tuesday night over GWS.

All of Adelaide's eight goals came in the first and third quarters while kicking towards the scoreboard end of Adelaide Oval. GWS clawed their way back in the second term, and attempted to do likewise in the final quarter but the Crows five third quarter goals proved too much of a task. The Crouch brothers were amongst the Adelaide's best, as Brad (31 disposals, 4 clearances) and Matt (27, one goal, 12 tackles) not only got plenty of the Sherrin, but also used it well with plenty of entries inside forward 50.

Former Kenilworth junior Rory Laird was outstanding as an inside midfielder, racking up a match-high 11 clearances and 18 contested possessions. Elliott Himmelberg and Shane McAdam, who have emerged as shining lights in what has been a dark season for Adelaide, kicked two goals apiece. Skipper Rory Sloane showed his selflessness with seven score involvements as well as kicking a key goal – though replays indicate it may have been touched off the boot.

Carlton were slow out of the blocks in their win over Sydney, with the Swans kicking the first seven goals of the match. Carlton's first goal didn't come until halfway through the second quarter, however Sydney could only manage one more major from that time, to enable Carlton sneak over the line. Sam Walsh was dominant in the midfield for Carlton with 25 disposals and a game-high 584 metres gained. Patrick Cripps was instrumental in the Blues' fightback with seven disposals, two clearances and a goal in the second quarter to keep Carlton in the match.

Carlton have no players on their list who were recruited from SA, though Eddie Betts was born in Port Lincoln and played junior footy at Mallee Park. He and Mitch McGovern are both former Crows who will suit up for Carlton.

Aside from the season-ending injuries to Tom Doedee (hamstring), Jordan Gallucci (achilles) and Wayne Milera (foot), Adelaide will go into the match with their shortest injury list for the season. Carlton will be without big man Matthew Kruezer, Charlie Curnow and the Silvagni brothers.

Adelaide's confidence and belief should be at their peak for season 2020, while frustration may be setting in for Carlton as finals, though mathematically possible, look to be beyond their grasp. **Adelaide by 13-24 points**

# Port ready to ignite the Power against a disappointing Bombers

Well, that's exactly what happened as the Power strengthened their position on top of the ladder with a 36-point win over North Melbourne last Saturday, coming after wins over Sydney (26-points) and Hawthorn (10-points) in the previous weeks.

Port's win over the Roos was a pretty routine win with runs of four consecutive goals coming in the first and third quarters. Up against a much younger and less physical midfield, Port's inside bulls had a field day. Travis Boak (34 disposals, nine clearances, seven inside 50's and a goal) sealed another three Brownlow votes while Tom Rockliff (30 disposals and nine tackles) and Ollie Wines (30 disposals, seven clearances, five inside 50's and two goals) were also at their best.

Second year player Zak Butters continued has great season with another 17 disposals, six score involvements and a goal, but a late hit on North's Jy Simpkin came under scrutiny by the MRO. Butters' late bump left Simpkin concussed and the youngster will now have to serve a two-game suspension, ruling him out until finals.

Defender Ryan Burton's horror injury run continued when he strained a quad in the first term. Ken Hinkley will be forced to make two changes with Boyd Woodcock the likely replacement for Butters, and Sam Mayes, Ryan Bonner or Joel Garner the most likely to come in for Burton.

Essendon will be coming into the clash will almost the opposite form line to the Power, suffering two disappointing losses in its last two outings. They were gallant against West Coast (15-point defeat) but smashed by Geelong by 11 goals last Sunday.

The Bombers finals chances are now gone but they will still want to put in a far better performance than what they showed against the Cats. One of its biggest problem areas was the midfield, with the Bombers midfield mix of Darcy Parish, Dyson Heppel, Zach Merret and Dylan Shiel just not able to match it against the Cats' bigger bodies.


Port's midfield will be licking its lips and eyeing a similar result to last week's midfield battle against the Roos. The Power were +10 in contested possession, +15 in clearances and +6 in inside 50 while in the Bombers match against Geelong, they were -13 in contested possession, -9 in clearances and -15 in inside 50's.



The Redlegs smashed the Eagles in the disposal count by 103 touches, giving the Eagles only their second loss for the year, with Norwood looking like a team that could squeeze into finals and do some damage. Unfortunately for Jarrod Cotton the momentum did not carry through to last Saturday where they went down by 13 points to the bottom-placed Centrals. The Redlegs who lead at three-quarter-time, won the clearances and the Hit outs and had 17 more inside 50's, but could not get the job done. Richard Douglas gathered a whopping 37 disposals in a side that lost the Disposal count. The Redlegs have played some good football this year with Richard Douglas and Sam Baulderstone having fantastic seasons. Douglas is third in the league with disposals averaging 26.5 while Baulderstone is leading the league in Hit-outs with 412. A positive for Norwood in the last three weeks has been their second quarters, averaging 5 goals in the second term.

The Double Blues on the other hand, surprised the Panthers on Saturday with a 33-point win at Peter Motley Oval! A tight tussle most of the day, Sturt kicked four goals to record their second straight win. Sam Colquhoun continued his solid season claiming first best and collecting a game high 30 disposals. Colquhoun alongside skipper Battersby have been prolific for the Double Blues this season, who average 25.2 and 26.3 disposals per game for the season respectively. Mark Evans has top scored for the Double Blues on the scoreboard the last two weeks, bagging five goals the last fortnight. Players such as Guy Page, Steven Slimming and Jack Henderson have been impressive in their last two wins. A positive sign for coach Nathan Grima has been their dominance in the inside 50 count, winning the count four out of the last five weeks. Since their Round nine loss to the Eagles, Sturt have also won the disposal and marking count, so the Double Blues will be looking to be dominant in those areas on Friday night against the Redlegs.

Every week of this unorthodox SANFL season brings us many surprises, with it being impossible to predict what is going to happen next. If there is anything that this SANFL season and the year 2020 has taught us, it is to expect the unexpected.

The Redlegs have won the last 5 against the Double Blues including a nail biter last time they met at the parade, where they won by five points. I think this game will again be an absolute nail biter under the Friday night lights at Coopers stadium.

### Bays in a thriller and look for double chance

A fortnight ago I lamented some predictable results through the middle of the SANFL season. Now, with three rounds to go, the door is ajar for six teams to fill five spots in the finals race. Sitting pretty atop the ladder, for now, are the Woodville West Torrens Eagles after overcoming a slow start to outmuscle the Roosters in an entertaining clash on Sunday.

They host Glenelg this weekend at Maughan Thiem Kia oval – Glenelg were the only other form team whose weekend went according to plan, accounting for the Bloods by reigning 21 goals on them from half of their 22 men.

It sets up a winnable game for Glenelg, who snuck past Norwood, the two teams trading 4th and 5th spot for some time now; they also have Sturt hot on their heels and South in their sights after Sturt roared back into contention with their 6 goal win over the Panthers.

This game is between two teams relatively assured of a finals berth. Zac Milbank reckons the eagles have one hand on the minor premiership, I reckon they have but a pinky finger. Should Glenelg win this they have the dogs straight after a do-or-die game against the Roosters, and Sturt after a do-or die-game against the Roosters, then Glenelg won't settle for a double chance – they'll be looking for the bye.

They will get there if their forward half can fire anywhere near as efficiently as last week. 11 individual goalkickers, six of them in the first quarter alone, combined for the highest output of the season, eclipsing Norwood's score against the same opponent back in round six. Marlon Motlop was the star with 4 goals and 20+ disposals, along with a half dozen teammates. Marlon's biggest haul last season was only 3 goals, yet they came in the Grand Final last year. He has not missed a game since round 5, when these two teams last met and he was held goalless, so expect another big game from the Larrakia forward.

Glenelg did not take more than their fair share of possession to share the scoring, these goals coming from 5 fewer clearances and 15 fewer marks than the Bloods, who now languish at the bottom of the ladder with three brutal matchups left.

The Eagles certainly will not allow them as many shots on goal, accounting for the Roosters by 50 touches, nearly 20 inside 50s, holding North Adelaide to 14 scoring shots, and holding them in second place, in a show of force against the predominant form team. Whereas Motlop and the Bays dined out last week, Jack Hayes dug in for the Eagles in producing a 3-goal haul, his one-two punch just before 3QT, and in time on in the 4th gave Woodville West Torrens much needed wiggle room at the top of the ladder.

Hayes only needed the 1 goal last these two teams met, back in round 5, which was a high scoring affair for his teammates and the tall timber across both teams, though the eagles held a cozy lead throughout the match. This tells me that some key Glenelg defenders will need to leave their matchups to take intercept marks, and the mids should consider going 'chaos ball' when they move forward. It is a buzzword in the AFL, but as we saw in the Western Bulldogs v West Coast Eagles game, it was an effective tactic against a team similar in name and style of play.

I reckon the bays will get up in a nail biter, and make a late charge to the top once more. Glenelg by 1-12 points

### Roosters eager to snap a losing streak

North Adelaide will be eager to snap a two-game losing streak on Sunday when they host Centrals at Prospect Oval. The Roosters had opportunities over the last fortnight to claim top spot on the ladder, but they will have to settle for second after a disappointing two-point loss against Glenelg followed by a 25-point loss in the top of the table clash against The Eagles. The Bulldogs will come into the game carrying more confidence than they have all season after winning their first two games of the season over the last three weeks, including last week's upset over Norwood to potentially spoil their season. The Bulldogs will be feeling better than they have all year, but will that be enough to help them compete against one of the league's best teams?

The midfield battle will be one to watch closely in this match up, headlined by the league's disposal leader in James Boyd, who is averaging a whopping 31 touches per game. Boyd has been starring for more than 200 league games and appears to show no signs of slowing down, but can he find more support to take on a Roosters midfield who have consistently got the job done all year? North's midfield boasts former AFL players Harrison Wigg and Andrew Moore, who are both among the top 10 league's disposal leaders.

The Bulldogs' inability to keep teams off the scoreboard this season has cost them, and North will punish them if their defence isn't structurally sound. Centrals have allowed 940 points in their 11 games this season, which ranks dead last in the league. North Adelaide have allowed the second-fewest points this season with 697, while also outscoring Centrals for the season by 96 points. Although their defence has been a weak point, the scoring power of The Bulldogs can be competitive and has proven to be enough to outscore opponents.

Lewis Hender looms as another key player, as the forward has had another tremendous season with his ability to hit the scoreboard. He only managed to kick one goal in their last encounter with The Bulldogs earlier in the season, but with an average of more than two goals per game Hender will be a tough assignment for a poor Bulldogs defence. Ending the season as the league's leading goalkicker may seem a longshot for Hender at this point as he trails by nine goals, but he kicked a bag of seven earlier in the season and the feat certainly isn't out of the question for the man who leads the Roosters' forward line.

Although Centrals will be high on confidence after a couple of good wins, North Adelaide will go in as heavy favourites as they try to put an end to their losing streak and climb towards top spot on the ladder. I expect North to get out with the win on their own turf, but not without a solid fight from a Centrals team who are starting to click late in the season. North Adelaide by 25-36 points

### Is the Brownlow Medal really the best individual honour?

The Brownlow Medal is AFL's night of all nights. It has all the glitz and glamour of a red carpet event as players, partners, AFL staff, coaches, and former winners come together to celebrate. As viewers we speculate, perhaps placing bets between families and friends, about who will take out the medal. We judge every dress that walks down the red carpet, vocalising our opinions to those watching with us. Most of all, it is a night to reflect on the season that was and kicking off the excitement of Grand Final week.



However, while we hype up the night and the event is celebrated in style, is it a true reflection of who played the most consistent and compelling season? The Brownlow medal is an award presented to a player who received the most votes according to the umpires. While the umpires are a critical part of the game, are they necessarily the best people to determine the best player for the season? The field umpires are heavily involved in the game, but it is not their job to study

other teams and players. Their opinions and voting decisions are dictated only by what they see, which you can argue is not the most credible voting source. Umpires are focused on enforcing the rules of the game, and even then they don't get it right 100 per cent of the time.

It is a fair argument to suggest that coaches and players are in a better position to determine the most valuable player of the season. Sure, they are involved in how the game unfolds, and more aware of the oppositions movements. But, if anything, it is the extensive analysis that coaches and players do before, during and after that puts them in the best position.

Players and coaches awards already exist. The Leigh Matthews Trophy and the AFL Coaches Association Champion Player of the Year are determined by the players and coaches respectively. So why is the Brownlow Medal considered the AFL's highest individual honour? As a player, I imagine being voted by your peers and expert coaching staff throughout the AFL would feel like a greater achievement. If the same player won all three awards every year then this argument is pointless, but the awards often have different results. For example, in the past 20 years, the Brownlow medallist winner/s and the Leigh Matthews Trophy winner were different (in the same season) 11 times. The differing results certainly suggest different approaches in determining the AFL's most valuable player.

Either way the Brownlow Medal is an AFL tradition that will evolve with our game, and the prestige of the night cannot be argued, even if it is influenced. It is a night which celebrates the best players of our game, while also including the legends of old. As the 2020 season draws closer to finals, the Brownlow Medal predictions will start firing up. It will certainly be a Brownlow to remember as COVID will change the dynamic of the night.

### Still reason to fly as 1 in 21

On the eve of Round One 2020, it was assumed Adelaide would endure a difficult season, but to be 1-13 with only three games remaining was far the expectations of the football world. Albeit a young and emerging club, the Crows have suffered their lowest fall in club history. Unless they win the next three games against Greater Western Sydney, Carlton and Richmond, and North Melbourne continue losing, they will almost certainly miss the finals for a record-equalling third consecutive season, and also 'win' their maiden wooden spoon.

With up and coming, young talent in Darcy Fogarty, Elliott Himmelberg, Fischer McAsey, Harry Shoenberg, Lachlan Murphy, Tyson Stengle, Riley O'Brien and Shane McAdam expected to play major minutes this season. As well as retaining a strong nuclease of experienced players in the Crouch brothers, Bryce Gibbs, Daniel Talia, David Mackay, Luke Brown, Rory Sloane, Taylor Walker and Tom Lynch, it was not unrealistic for Adelaide fans to expect a competitive side, certainly capable of producing more than one win. It is now obvious, rookie coach Matthew Nicks has a lot of shuffling to do over the pre-season.

While the Crows had a well-known 'clean out' last year with the departures of Andy Otten, Eddie Betts, Josh Jenkins, Richard Douglas, Sam Jacobs and the like, it seems this may need to happen again. Bryce Gibbs and David Mackay both appear to be in their final seasons, expected to be shown the door. Brad Crouch seems more likely to seek a move to Victoria than not, but the Crows should be aiming to keep Matt, who struggles to avoid the 'trade-talk.' While Talia and Sloane are still valuable enough in their positions and impact on the team, and it is likely Tom Lynch will return for 2021, Taylor Walker is the sentimental one.

While no one can deny the contribution Walker has made for Adelaide both on and off the field, captaining the team through its darkest time of 2015 with the tragic death of Phil Walsh, and two years later being just the second man in club history to captain them into a Grand Final, it seems the best has passed for Tex. While he is the heart and soul for Adelaide, it is not about Walker anymore, he is realistically not going to be part of the Crows next premiership, which is not a strong prospect for at least 4-8 years. Where it is different in respect to Talia and Sloane, Walker is unfortunately taking the position away from either Darcy Fogarty or Elliot Himmelberg, who over the next decade are going to be the central of Adelaide's attack, along with Murphy and Stengle.

While Fogarty and Himmelberg are still developing, they need to be given maximum game time for hands-on experience to learn their craft and create chemistry between one another. While it seems unlikely at this stage, the two could eventually form a dynamic duo similar to that of a

Hawthorn 'Franklin-Roughead', capable of kicking 40-80 goals per season each. This cannot be done if Taylor Walker is in the way, either physically taking their spot or being seen by midfielders and defenders as the 'go-to-man'. A prime example of where this works is last season's dropping and eventual trading of Sam Jacobs, who for years was Adelaide's lead ruckman. The club finally made the decision to play Riley O'Brien instead, which has paid dividends and he is now beginning to flourish.

Adelaide has historically had a difficult time moving on, ten years ago they continued to play the ageing likes of Andrew McLeod, Brett Burton, Simon Goodwin and Tyson Edwards over the young Daniel Talia, Patrick Dangerfield and Rory Sloane types, this was part of the reason they endured 11th and 14th finishes in 2010-2011. They waited too long and were subsequently forced to field a side of 18 year old's with no experience, after those older players all retired at the same time, and they had not previously tried the young talent evenly with consistent pace.

Adelaide are in a tough spot now, part of that is again holding on to those older players too long, then departing them at once and being forced to field too many younger players all at once without even progression. Next season, Matthew Nicks will surely need to see his side win significantly more games, or else he too could be in a spot of bother. As long as Crows fans can see the younger players out there, with a decent nuclease of experience in the correct places, there is still reason to fly as one.

It's been a difficult year for all clubs this season, but it seems no team more so than the Adelaide Crows have buckled under the pressure of fly-in-fly-out games, hubs and a compressed fixture. After losing many of their star players in the off-season including Eddie Betts, Cam Ellis-Yolmen, Alex Keath, Josh Jenkins and Sam Jacobs, the Crows said they would begin a rebuild, but no one could have expected this.

The Crows have gone from top to bottom in just three years. When there are only two South Australian teams in the competition the chances of them being on completely opposite sides of the ladder is extremely rare. So when your cross-town rivals Port Adelaide are the ladder-leaders while the Adelaide Crows are 18th and bottom there really isn't much to smile about.

It's been a challenging season for Crows fans to watch loss after loss after loss. Injury concerns aside, the Crows need to completely change their game plan for the remainder of the season if they have any shot of winning a single game and not being the first club in 56 years to be winless for an entire season. They have to create contests, win clearances and set-up better defensively. They are only averaging four marks inside-50 a game and need to improve in the midfield exponentially. They are letting teams too easily take the ball out the middle and quickly move it into their (Crows') defensive-50 and score. Changes also need to be made off-field.

It's been over 380 days since the Crows last secured victory and while it is a feat, it's one I'm sure they are not proud of. With a current record of zero wins and 12 losses, the question remains: will it be a winless season for the Crows? For some reason I have a feeling we might see them achieve the biggest upset this year, beating Geelong at home. Now you may ask why I would think that, but given the Crows are highly underestimated, they literally have nothing to lose, and they will want to prove everyone wrong, this might just be their game to win. Nevertheless, the Crows will no doubt finish bottom of the ladder and receive the wooden spoon for the first time in their 30-year history.




