



TWO TEAMS DOWN, FOUR TO GO.


St Kilda vs Western Bulldogs

Geelong vs. Collingwood

Geelong have only won four of sixteen finals games since 2011, as their finals woes continued in Thursday night's qualifying final. Despite just a one-point deficit going into halftime, Geelong struggled to regain momentum and when the pressure was on, Geelong just couldn't handle it. They are the most experienced finals team and yet they lost to an inexperienced and youthful side in Port Adelaide. With equal inside 50s as the Power, Geelong just didn't make the most of their opportunities. Tom Hawkins the Coleman Medallist kicked five behinds from six set shots. The semi-final match will be a real test for the Cats who have so far underachieved when it counts most. Geelong's big men will be important to stopping Mihocek and Cox.

Most had written Collingwood off for their elimination final against West Coast, but the Pies proved doubters wrong and managed to hold on in what was a nail-bitting one-point win at Optus Stadium. Injuries have plagued Collingwood for the season, which has certainly had an impact on their performances thus far. However, watching them against West Coast they seemed to have a different energy and drive about them, they were going in hard at the ball and like always their midfield group lead by Scott Pendlebury was elite and their forward line was superb. With such a tall line-up to compete against and the clearances to be a crucial component to their performance, it will be interesting to see whether Brodie Grundy spends more time in the ruck – after playing just 63 percent of the game against the Eagles on field. When Brodie Grundy is on, so are Collingwood!

With both sides competing tall it will be all about who can win the battle in the midfield. Will the deciding factor be Pendlebury, Adams and Treloar or Dangerfield, Selwood and Ablett? I think it's going to be a real 50/50 contest and the team who is able to really bring it on the night will win. The last time these two sides met, Collingwood got the better of Geelong defeating them at Optus Stadium by 22 points in round 7. But I expect the semi-final to go right down to the wire, with both sides having something to prove and Collingwood coming out on top.

The Power of Risk

Injuries and concussions are a plague on almost all AFL players. Whether it's a major head concussion or a minor twist of the ankle, every player in the league will eventually experience some sort of injury. The question then arises of whether Australian Football is too dangerous a sport for kids and adults alike to play.

The most common types of injuries occur when players are being tackled or struck from their opponents, and when falling from attempted marks in the air. These types of incidents usually result in either knee or ankle injuries, which can remain with a player for the rest of their career. Concussions don't occur as often as bruised knees or twisted ankles, but they are among one of the most dangerous injuries a player can receive.

So, what should we do about this? Should we enforce rules that help protect players from such injuries? Should we change the rules to make the sport less dangerous? Well, obviously the answer is no. Such things would destroy the sport we all know and love. But, more importantly, destroy ourselves.

Here's an example. In Jordan B. Peterson's bestselling book "12 Rules For Life," rule 11 is "do not bother children when they are skateboarding." Peterson makes the case that the governors of a local Toronto council were wrong to fill the skateboarding rinks with sand to stop children from injuring themselves. Peterson goes on to say: "Of course it was dangerous. Danger was the point. The kids wanted to triumph over danger. They weren't trying to be safe. They were trying to be competent."

Competence is the ability to do something successfully, while being able to show sufficient knowledge and judgement in particular situations. It is competence, then, that distinguishes leaders from followers. Or in other words, captains from teammates. In a sense, captains are the wisest of players because they have willingly put themselves in dangerous situations and learned how to overcome them. Simply put, it is the willingness to put yourself in a dangerous situation that will give rise to the courage and resilience that is already inside you. That is what distinguishes the strong from the weak.

The next time the AFL thinks about creating or changing rules, they must ask themselves "at what cost?" The quest to reduce any form of risk in anything is a dangerous one, and is something that runs deeper than just mere physical injuries. Risk strengthens our character. It creates leaders out of men. In the words of Peterson himself, "if you think tough men are dangerous, wait until you see what weak men are capable of."





Match Previews

THE DIVISION 1



That one day of the year, which all sides strive and play to be a part of. Finally come around on Sunday afternoon. In a year, when the season looked like it would never start, we were graced with a grand final for the ages on Sunday. For the first time since 1984, the amateur league grand final took place at Norwood Oval. Two different combatants than the ones that took the field 36-years ago. Indeed both of those teams are no longer are in existence in their own right. Back in 1984, Riverside took on Greek, with Riverside winning a thriller. Rostrevor however, will lament the lost opportunities late in the third term as they booted 4 behinds. O'Malley, Manuel, Short and Reinbrecht all kicked inaccurately. Goals here, would have put Rostrevor in front at lemon time. Rostrevor were left ruing what might have been. Goodwood Saints led by 9-points at three guarter time and a fight to the death was inevitable. Early in the final term Reinbrecht kicked accurately and drew the lead back to 4-points and the game was most certainly heating up. 11-points in front. James Butterworth kicked a late behind for Rostrevor, when they desperately needed goals. Only a few minutes later however Frazer Goodes, kicked one of the goals of the season from deep inside the forward pocket to put Goodwood Saints 16-points in front. This would remain the margin of the premiership win. Goodes was superb for Goodwood Saints with his 4 goals andwas best-a field. While evergreen Nick Burgess, Nicholas Favretto, Scott Blesing and Tom Gehling who celebrated his 100th game on Sunday, were all outstanding. For the vanguished in Rostrevor Old Collegians. Tom O'Malley, Anthony McCarthy, Craig Holm, Nick Murphy, Dylan Reinbrecht and Stefan Lanzoni were very good. Reinbrecht and Murphy were the only multiple goal kickers for Rostrevor with 2 goals each. For Goodwood Saints, it was their 8th premiership since 2005, whilst never having lost on grand final day since 2004. The club came into division one in 1991 and have not been out of the top flight of football. Having played for 30 consecutive years in division one. The Saints waited until 1997 to taste the sweet taste of success in division one, when they won the flag for the fist time defeating PHOS Camden by 7-points. 1998, 1999 and 2004 ended in grand final defeats for the Saints. That loss in 2004, was the last they would suffer on the ultimate day. Goodwood have not been beaten in a grand final since 2004 but have won 7 division one premierships, which is beyond phenomenal. After their loss in 2004 to Broadview, Goodwood then won the next 5 premierships in succession. One of those premierships was under Trevor Hill, but the next four under Trent Mills. The Saints won flags from 2005 until 2009. In 2008 the Saints made history to become the first club in win 4 successive division 1 premierships. From 2010 until 2013 Goodwood finished 3rd each season, before again winning the flags in 2014 and 2015. Year 2020 is yet again, the year of Goodwood Saints.
