

Port Adelaide v Richmond

Adelaide Oval - 7.20pm (Friday)

Is the Power finally about to go out in 2020?

Port Adelaide will be looking to advance to its first AFL Grand Final since 2007 when it takes on Richmond in Friday night's first preliminary final. The Power have sat on top of the ladder since round one and they won the right to a home preliminary final a fortnight ago when it beat Geelong by 16 points. Port has now won six games in a row and will also be playing the prelim at its home; the Adelaide Oval, but despite this, (at the time of writing) the two teams can't be split in the betting markets. Port will almost definitely go into this match unchanged, meaning Travis Boak, Brad Ebert, Robbie Gray, Hamish Hartlett, Tom Jonas, Ollie Wines and Scott Lycett (with West Coast) will be its only players that have played in a prelim final.

Todd Marshall (AC joint) and Xavier Duursma (concussion) both injured themselves against Geelong but will be good to go on Friday night. Marshall showed great courage by returning to the field while Duursma putting his body on the line and going back with the flight would've inspired his teammates. Geelong were wayward early and probably should've led by a couple of goals at half-time, but Port found its noses in front thanks to a Brad Ebert set shot after the siren. Port were then able to carry this momentum into the third term where it kicked three goals to one to set up the win. As they have consistently for the last month, Travis Boak, Ollie Wines and Tom Rockliff all found plenty of the ball and were able to ensure Port won the midfield battle. Robbie Gray also added some class to the mix while Sam Powell-Pepper (five first quarter clearances) set the tone early.

When these two teams played earlier this year, Port were dominant in this area of the game and it had 43 more contested possessions, 18 more clearances and 31 more inside 50's. The Tigers were without Jack Graham and Shane Edwards who will both be hoping they can help their teammates at least break even in this area on Friday. Of Richmond's 22 that beat St Kilda last week, just Marlion Pickett and Noah Balta have never played in a prelim. That being said, Pickett did of course debut in an even bigger game, last year's Grand Final.

Tom Lynch kicked 2.5 last week against St Kilda and is going to cause all sorts of headaches for Port's defence. Hinkley will most likely give Trent McKenzie the 1v1 match-up to start, which will allow both Tom Clurey and Jonas to pressure and intercept further up the field. Port's pressure both around stoppage and on the ball carrier in going to be crucial to prevent Lynch from getting silver service from Richmond's quality midfield. It will definitely be a gamble for Hinkley to give McKenzie the match-up, but he and Port Adelaide have been backing in its own game-style all year so there's no reason to go away from that now. The Tigers dropped their qualifying final to Brisbane but bounced back strongly in last week's semi-final against St Kilda. As he usually does in big games, Dustin Martin led from the front and was one of the most influential players on the ground. He had 25 disposals, 10 inside 50's, six clearances, nine score involvements and a goal. It's the kind of performance that could be the difference in this week's prelim and Ken Hinkley will have to put plenty of time into his planning if the Power are going to be able to shut the Tigers down.

Sam Powell-Pepper could be sent to Martin while he is playing in the midfield, while Jonas will likely take the match-up when Dusty inevitably ventures forward. In round 11, these two teams played the 'game of the year' as it was coined at the time, and you can expect another fierce, tight contest in this one. Port is playing at home and will have almost 30,000 fans cheering it on, but given this is the Tigers fourth prelim in as many years, I think they will have what it takes to win, but this game is going to be a close as the betting markets suggest. **Richmond by 1-12 points**

Port Adelaide v Richmond

Adelaide Oval - 7.20pm (Friday)

The Tigers are September specialists

Richmond's premiership defence took a hit when they lost their qualifying final to Brisbane two weeks ago, and now they must face Port Adelaide - who have been top all season - in front of The Power's biggest home crowd this season to keep the back-to-back dream alive. The Tigers are a veteran side with premiership experience, so the road trip likely will not phase them as much as it would many other teams, but Port are hungry to claim the premiership in their 150th anniversary year.

Richmond have won three of the past five encounters with Port Adelaide; Four of the sides' last five head to head matches have been decided by 21 points or less, and three by 14 points or less. Last time they met was in round 11, when The Power won by 21 points at Adelaide Oval. Port were dominant but wasteful in front of goal kicking just 13.15 to Richmond's much more opportunistic 11.6. The Tigers did a magnificent job of fighting back twice after Port Adelaide got two big leads in the first and the third quarter, but were hold scoreless in the fourth as The Power opened the quarter with three lightning quick goals to seal the match.

Charlie Dixon looms as the most important man on the ground entering this final. When Dixon doesn't fire, The Power don't win, it's just that simple. In their three losses this year, Dixon kicked a grand total of 1.2 from just 17 total disposals, including three disposals and no score against Geelong in round 12. The loss was Dixon's only scoreless game of the season, and his only other goalless game was in the round 5 loss to Brisbane. Will Dylan Grimes get the job on Dixon, or will Richmond look elsewhere?

Port Adelaide's small defensive unit will also have its hands full with Tom Lynch and Jack Riewoldt. After kicking goals in 15 consecutive games, Riewoldt was scoreless last week against St Kilda from just four disposals. He managed to kick two goals in the preceding week's qualifying final, but still only amassed six disposals. Riewoldt may push further up the ground in this one as he looks to get himself more involved, but also to give Tom Lynch more space in the forward 50 against The Power's undersized defenders. Lynch was dangerous (albeit inaccurate) last week against an inexperienced St Kilda defence, and will need to have a similar impact on this game. He was kept to eight disposals, three marks and one goal when the teams last met in round 11. Captain Tom Jonas will most likely start on Lynch.

The key forwards can't fire if the midfield can't deliver them the ball, and the battle in the middle of the ground is going to be a thriller. Dustin Martin, Tom Rockliff and Ollie Wines are in elite form currently, Travis Boak has had arguably the best year of his career, Trent Cotchin saves his best footy for finals, and a host of others including Dion Prestia, Zak Butters, Shai Bolton, and Sam Powell-Pepper have all shown class through the midfield all season. The battle to win the contested footy will be as hot in this game as we've seen all year.

Port have been top all year, have the home ground advantage, and won their only meeting this season, so it seems insane to tip against them. Richmond, on the other hand, have been THE team to beat since September 2017 and always save their best footy for the biggest stage. This will be a true battle of the titans, and the winner will almost definitely be the flag favourite next week. **Richmond by 1-12 points**





Brisbane v Geelong

Hardened Cats to teach unproven Lions a finals lesson to book their GF spot

After a lacklustre start to their finals campaign, which had pundits questioning their finals record, Geelong bounced back on Saturday night with an emphatic display against a flat Collingwood side – who could only manage one goal up to three quarter time.

With Joel Selwood taking his place in the midfield after finger surgery just a week ago (and playing in his 32nd final behind only Michael Tuck 39 and Shaun Burgoyne 35), Patrick Dangerfield was able to spend most the match inside forward 50 and finished with four goals, 19 disposals and six marks. His determination was clear to see as he laid tackles, flew for grabs, split packs and created more goals than he kicked. Dangerfield will play in his fifth preliminary final this weekend, and will be desperate to win his first.

Mitch Duncan was the best player behind Dangerfield with 30 disposals, including 19 in the first half, while Cam Guthrie and Sam Menegola were also outstanding. Defensive pair Tom Stewart and Lachie Henderson were critical in shutting down any chances for the impotent Pies, who could only manage seven forward 50 disposals for the first half – Tom Hawkins matched this figure singlehandedly on his way to matching Dangerfield with four goals in a return to form after his forgettable match against Port.

Brisbane will be well rested after winning their qualifying final against Richmond, earning the week off and booking their first preliminary finals spot since 2004. Charlie Cameron is Brisbane's barometer and was in scintillating form, kicking three goals against the Tigers, and providing the forward line with great energy and intensity. He will need to bring the same game this week against Geelong to match what Dangerfield will, no doubt, be doing at the other end. Brisbane's goal kicking accuracy has been a talking point for them in big games recently. While this wasn't an issue against Richmond, if Geelong's defence are as miserly as they were against Collingwood, the Lions are going to have limited shots in front of goal and will need to make the most of each chance they get.

While Brisbane have earned the right to home ground advantage, the Gabba will hold no fears for Geelong, winning all four of their matches at the ground this year, with an average winning margin of 56 points. Geelong have been incredibly accurate in front of goal in their four visits, kicking a total of 59 goals and 37 behinds.

In their Round 6 encounter at the SCG, Geelong ran away with a five goal win over the Lions. After trailing by 10 points at halftime they piled on seven unanswered third quarter goals to teach Brisbane a lesson in tempo football. If the Lions are to match it with Geelong on Saturday night they are going to need to find an extra gear when the Cats lift the intensity of the match in the premiership quarter.

As with the other preliminary final, this matchup is one of experienced finals campaigners, possibly past their best, against a hungry, but inexperienced side. Geelong has missed finals just once in 14 seasons and is about to embark on its fourth preliminary final in five years, but haven't won one since their 2011 Premiership. The Lions have had two outstanding seasons and are striving to create a lasting legacy under Chris Fagan, but it will ultimately be a wasted two years if they can't get the job done against the Cats. **Geelong by 25-36 points**

Richmond and Port Adelaide are set to face each other on Friday night after the Tigers overcame a determined St Kilda. While, Geelong breezed to a Prelim against Brisbane after a dominant performance against Collingwood last Saturday night.

The Cats and the Lions will line up against each other on Saturday night. Both games are set to be incredible games, and no doubt will be close finishes.

Port Adelaide vs Richmond

After coming off the back of a win against the Saints, the Tigers will be in-form for the Preliminary final. However, Port Adelaide should be feeling refreshed after having the week off. But, who will win? Well both teams have their strengths and weaknesses, so it will come down to who can exploit the other's weakness for longer. Richmond's game against Brisbane made it very clear that their team plays in short bursts and cannot hold a high-pressure intensity for long

periods of time. Therefore, it is so important for Port Adelaide to take advantage of Richmond's 'drop-off' stages and attack offensively. Port Adelaide are one of the top teams in the competition for their pressure efforts on the ball. While Richmond do pressure effectively when they try, the Tigers have shown that they cannot maintain a high level for longer periods. Although Port Adelaide need to be careful of Richmond's ability to score quickly in short bursts. Last week against the Saints, Richmond scored a few goals directly after a Saints goal which made the Saints efforts pointless. Its an Eagles flag in a thriller

Well after a rollercoaster of a season with never before seen or experienced circumstances, the SANFL Grand Final is finally here! Four or five months ago, a SANFL season was looking unlikely and was looking to be scrapped for the first time since World War 1. However, here we are in the middle of spring and October with footy finals frenzy still upon us. With the SANFL being only one of two state leagues being played around the country due to the COVID-19 pandemic, makes this season and grand final just that little bit more special.

It's the North Adelaide Roosters against the Woodville-West Torrens Eagles in what is a history-making clash. These two sides have not played each other in a grand final since the amalgamation of Woodville and West Torrens in 1990. The only time these sides have some sort familiarity in grand final was when North Adelaide played West Torrens in 1949, where the Australian currency was still Australia Pound.

In 2020, both teams have neighboured in positions 1 and 2 on the SANFL ladder and have been the best two sides all year. The three times these sides have played each other this year have all been arm wrestles. Jade Sheedy's Eagles were too good in rounds 4 and 11 winning by 15 and 25 points however, the Roosters pushed them in both games. Roosters Coach Jacob Surjan got revenge in the next meeting, defeating the Eagles by 15 points in the semi-final. It was the start that helped the Roosters last time they played the Eagles, kicking the first three goals inside eight minutes.

With the Roosters enjoying the weekend off, the Eagles were too good for the Panthers in last Sundays Preliminary Final. The Eagles got off to an inaccurate start kicking 3.8 in the first quarter to be down by six points. The second half the eagles kicked into gear and kicked nine goals to two in the second half including seven goals in the third quarter. Players of note for the Eagles included James Tsitas with 30 disposals and James Rowe who continued his fantastic season with five goals. James Tsitas and James Rowe will be looking to have big games again this weekend.

A big part to the Roosters Victory a couple of weeks ago was the Combe brothers. William kicked three majors along with a game an equal game-high six clearances. His Brother Campbell gathered 17 disposals along with a game-high 10 tackles, repeating his fantastic 2020 tackling form. Both players featured in the best players with William collecting first best and Campbell receiving third best. The Roosters have won the first quarter in all three contests this season and will be looking o continue those fast starts this weekend. Even though the Eagles don't get off to fast starts, they have finished matches well against the Roosters this year, winning the last quarter in all three contests this season.

The Eagles midfield has quality players such as Jimmy Toumpas, James Tsitas and Joseph Sinor. It will be an epic battle as they go head to head with the Roosters midfield of Andrew Moore, Harrison Wigg and Campbell Combe. Woodville-West Torrens are looking for there fourth premiership and there first in nine years. North Adelaide, however, are looking flag number 15 and there second premiership in three years. A hard game to predict, this game will include a number of lead changes throughout the day. Roosters set to Crow the loudest

Congratulations to both teams for making the Grand Final for season 2020. Straight off the bat, I predict the Eagles to bounce back and be crowned winners in the Grand Final. SANFL has guietly called this a season like no other. Their Digital Pass has a promotional intro with eight stirring yet innocent statements from players in each team, six of which have now proven untrue. For Woodville West Torrens, this was 'the year for the Eagles to fly'.

The Eagles had very few lapses across the season, but two damaging ones in their critical semifinal. The opening three goals unanswered became the eventual margin, whilst back-and-forth three-piece majors to both LeBois and Combe either side of half time snaffled the momentum and swiftly locked down the contest.

The semifinal was the highest scoring game of their three matchups, with just 10 goals sufficient to win each hard-fought contest. If the Roosters can go free-range for another half-dozen goals, they will be well perched for a second premiership in three years. Their last, in 2018, came after a Prelim Final win against the Eagles, with a little help for their 19th man.

The Eagles have some back to back grand final losses to atone for in 2015-2016, where they likewise finished as minor premiers and were unable to minor round success into the major rounds. Incidentally, Jarred Allmond played in both of those losses and now lines up to make it 2 from 2 with the Roosters instead. Jimmy Toumpas returns nearly a decade later from the 2011 premiership winning team that got home by three points. If they're to win the big dance again it will surely be by a small margin once more; 25 points was the biggest surplus all season and was the biggest margin of the day in Round 11 last month.

Nick Hayes is a key player for me, he has shown class all season and continues in the post season, hitting teammates lace-out when he is not going for goal himself. Unfortunately, the Eagles will certainly be sweating on the fitness of Jarrad Redden. He was put on ice in the fourth quarter in their fendoff of South Adelaide in the Preliminary final. As it's a shoulder, I suspect there's no amount of strapping that is too much to get him on the park.

The Prelim final was an emphatic win, particularly if your name is James Rowe, whose triplet of goals in the third ensured the Eagles would return to Adelaide oval one last time.

Midfielder and Man of the Hour Campbell Combe was back in Crystal Brook for the Roosters 2018 win; now premiership success is at the forefront of his mind. He had 19 tackles in the Semifinal if you don't mind. Those 19 tackles were as many as half of the Eagles team could manage combined. Clearly the umpires saw him often extracting himself from the pack week in week out, awarding the Magarey Medal to the humble recipient.

The North engine room were more efficient to the tune of 15 clearances and nearly 20 inside 50s. They also stopped their opponents inevitable rebound, forcing the Eagles to go by hand, less efficiently across the board, and fewer attempts at the big sticks, which is all that matters. By contrast North Adelaide have had more scoring shots with each successive crack at the Eagles. However, statistics will matter precious little when these two teams take the field on Sunday. A fast start and a cool finish will; and every inch of the contest in between. North Adelaide by 1-12 points

At the beginning of the year Port Adelaide coach Ken Hinkley said his side were coming, and so far, they have certainly delivered. Port Adelaide have been the team to beat all season, sitting on top of the ladder since round 1 and yet they have never really been thought of as a genuine premiership threat. After beating Geelong in the qualifying final by 16 points—despite losing to the Cats by 60 points in their last encounter—the Power earnt a home preliminary final and a week off, and people finally began to take the Power more seriously.

Rise from Tenth

After finishing the previous two years in a row in tenth position, the Power were eying off more than just a spot in the finals in 2020. They wanted to prove they had what it took to win the flag in their 150th year since the Port Adelaide Magpies were formed, and did they just that, taking the competition by storm. In the first game of the season, Port Adelaide played against the Gold Coast Suns at Metricon Stadium and absolutely dominated, winning by an impressive 47 points in a shorter game and in an away stadium with no supporters. This game would be the start of an incredible season for the Power. In round 2, Port were back on their home turf and showed up their cross-town rivals; Adelaide Crows, to thump them by 75 points. This was a Showdown like no other, not only did it have the smallest crowd ever, but it was also Port Adelaide's biggest ever Showdown win. This was no mean feat, as it was their first game back in three months, due to COVID-19 forcing the season to be suspended.

With only a few changes to their list from 2019 to 2020, the Power have gone above expectations to not only make finals but claim the minor premiership. In 2020 they also made the decision to revert to the traditional sole captain, with Tom Jonas taking on the role which has no doubt been a success.

The Young and the Old

The Power are an exciting team to watch with talent all over the ground. Compared to every other team, Port Adelaide have used the fewest number of players this season. Despite injuries, COVID-19 suspensions and poor individual on-field performances resulting in players being dropped, Port Adelaide have had a steady playing squad. Playing with the same 30 players all year has its advantages and their experience playing together and knowing how to win has certainly helped. This season Port Adelaide's side has featured 12 players aged 24 or under and they have all been instrumental to Port's rise. Talking Points

Port Adelaide play a tough and exciting brand of footy and rely on fast movement and pressure to move the ball forward. The Power are the number one team this season for tackles, averaging 57 tackles per game. Pressure along with centre clearance dominance will be the key areas they need to focus on in order to defeat the Tigers on Friday night. Richmond play a very similar game style to the Power and this has resulted in many close matches between the two over the past four years. The last time the Power met the Tigers they kept them scoreless in the last quarter to win by 21 points. Coming up against tall sides in Brisbane, Geelong and Saint Kilda, the Power buckled under the pressure and were unable to compete against and stop the opposition's tall forwards from marking and scoring. While this area on the ground was a major contributor in their three losses, it was not the case against any other teams in any of their wins.

What the Power have been able to do all year is push their opposition far into the Power's forward half of the ground, which while it enables teams on occasions to easily be able to score against them, when the Power concede a goal, they are able to bounce back quickly and lock the ball in their forward 50. This is what makes them such a damaging side, as they take control of the footy.

History in the Making

Port Adelaide have been one of the best teams this year, only losing a total of three out of eighteen games. In round 2, Port Adelaide became just the third team in the AFL and VFL to boost its percentage having come into the game with a percentage above 250%. It was a record that had not been broken in 116 years. While statistics do not always count for much, this statistic would show that despite shorter games, a compressed fixture and playing in a hub, the Power were very much on the right track to becoming minor premiers. The Power are also just the third team in the AFL's history to sit on top of the ladder the entire way through the home-and-away season. The last time they finished top, they also went on to win the flag.

Port Adelaide have all the ingredients of a great side, they play on instinct, they thrive on one another's energy, they celebrate big moments with a bow and arrow and a drum kit in tow and they challenge their opposition to bring it each week. They play with cheek, flair and passion and they own their victories and continue to

compete when the odds are against them. They are a club who is proud of their history and pride themselves on competing no matter the location. This is a side that deserves to be there on grand final day. Ken Hinkley is the coach to lead his team to victory, with a big cheeky grin on his face hidden beneath his calm exterior.

The week off. Blessing or curse?

The McIntyre final eight system the AFL (and NRL) use for their respective finals series, has been used for twenty years now. Majority of the time, there was rarely any dissatisfaction from the players, coaches media and fans. It seems as fair as can be, first and second host third and fourth respectively in Qualifying Finals. The winner is granted a week's rest and home Preliminary Final, the loser is forced to host

a home Semi Final. For the bottom half of the top eight, they are required to win four consecutive finals (all away games for 7th and 8th) in order to claim the ultimate glory.

Since 2016 however, the AFL implemented a bye week before the finals where all eight competing clubs had the opportunity to rest, prepare and recover from any injuries. The rule was bought in to allow all players the opportunity to be in the best possible condition for the best standard finals series possible. This rule coincided with the year the Western Bulldogs became the first club since 1998 to win a premiership from outside the top, winning four consecutive finals. The Bulldogs limped over the line this season, losing to 16th placed Fremantle in the final week of the home and away season with a mounting injury list. That pre-finals bye allowed the club to regain a large percentage of players to recover and be fit, ready to go for their Elimination Final in Perth. Chances are, had they not had the bye, they would not have even beaten West Coast, let alone won the Premiership. This is an example of the pre-finals bye being a possible blessing.

Geelong in 2016 oppose this, as they were one of the best teams in the competition. Finishing second on the ladder and beating Hawthorn by less than a goal in the Qualifying Final, they looked just about headed for the big dance. The Sydney Swans (minor premiers) lost their Qualifying Final to baby brothers GWS and therefore, had to host Adelaide in a Semi Final at the SCG before meeting Geelong at the MCG. Despite Geelong being hot favourites, the Swans slammed the first eight goals of the game and would run away with a commanding win to set up their Grand Final. There are many reasons Geelong did not win this game, but could having a week off before the finals, then another directly after that first final have been a reason? Only playing one game of football in twenty days against a club who have had continuity and been able to consistently play have been their downfall?

A similar example is Richmond of 2018 who were the best team in the competition by a long way, claiming the minor premiership and comfortably defeating Hawthorn in their Qualifying Final to secure a home Prelim after another week's break. They faced an underdog Collingwood side who were playing their third game in as many weeks, and similarly, the Tigers got off to a shocking start. At the 22nd minute mark of the second quarter, the score read 64-11 and the Pies on their

way to causing one of the biggest upsets in Preliminary Final history. Ironically, the year after Collingwood secured home ground advantage after another week off, and were handed a taste of their own medicine by GWS who upset the favourites by less than a goal in their third straight final.

The statistics show since the pre-finals bye, in three out of four seasons a club has lost their home Preliminary Final after winning a Qualifying Final and securing that extra week off. This was not so much the case pre-2016, as only 4/20 seasons saw a team from outside the top four reaching a Preliminary Final.

This begs the question, just how valuable is that week off? Does home ground advantage really matter all that much considering it would only be a club's second game in three weeks? History suggests not so much. Does this bode well for Port Adelaide and Brisbane, who this weekend will be doing something they haven't done in several days... playing.






